WALKING DELEGATE IS FATALLY SHOT
NEW YORK, July 25.—For attempting to bring a strike to a peaceful ending, George Prescott, walking delegate of the national teamsters' union, was shot today, probably fatally. Union teamsters employed by Jos. Johnson & Co., of Staten Island notified the union that they had struck and that non-union men were working in their place. When word was received of any kind, but when Prescott landed on the island to meet Mr. Johnson and discuss the strike his steps were dogged by two Italians, said to be non-union drivers, who at a lonely corner ordered Prescott to get out of the car and to get through the body once and stabbed him. The Italians were arrested.

FIFTY NEW DAILY PAPERS FOR IOWA
WASHINGTON, July 25.—Fourth Assistant Postmaster General Degraw today made public a communication to his department which states that 50 weekly and semi-weekly papers in various cities in Iowa are to be transformed into daily papers through an organization of capitalists whereby two pages of the papers are to be printed and circulated in the remaining two pages are to be printed with the local news. The plan is declared to have been made feasible through the great demand for news which those who live in the rural districts through the rural free delivery service.

WEALTHY BROKER COMMITS SUICIDE
NEW YORK, July 25.—Otto Bernheimer, a member of Bernheimer & Walker, cotton brokers of this city, and a wealthy man, committed suicide today in his apartments at the Hotel Seville. Bernheimer was found in his apartments lying in front of a full length mirror and dying from a bullet wound in the temple. He left no explanation of his act and his three brothers say he had every reason to wish to live, as far as they know. Bernheimer was 35 years old.

THREE MINERS ARE BLOWN TO PIECES
BANK, N. W. T., July 25.—While a number of miners were at work in the Bankhead mine an explosion of dynamite occurred which wrought awful havoc in the mine and killed three men. The dead are: Thomas Smiley, of Ireland; David Thomas, of Wales; John Williams, Wales.

IS 101 YEARS OLD AND GOES VISITING
MANISTIQUE, Mich., July 25.—Levi Rivers of Cooke, Schoolcraft county, who, since the recent death of Joseph C. Rivers, has been the oldest man living in the upper peninsula, has left for a visit with relatives in Wisconsin. He is more than 101 years of age, yet travels alone, being as active as the average man of 60 years.

VENEZUELA GIVES OUT TWO BIG MONOPOLIES
CARACAS, July 25.—The congress of Venezuela has ratified the contract made by the government with Senor Madueno for the establishment of the national bank of Venezuela and granting him the exclusive right of manufacturing cigarettes. Congress also endorsed the contract entered into with Jose Emilio Mora for grinding wheat. Both contracts are very important transactions.

PITTSBURG, July 25.—As the result of an explosion of a gasoline stove at the home of Levi Titus, 725 Wood Alley, Braddock, early today, Harry and Mervyn Titus, twins aged 12 and 13, were burned to death and five other members of the family were seriously burned, two fatally.

ALASKA AND NORWAY.
From the Portland Oregonian:
A country similar to Norway, though of far greater extent, is Alaska. The climate, resources and physical features of the two countries are much the same. Alaska has more resources in minerals, timber and fisheries, and perhaps equal or greater resources in agriculture. But Alaska is a new country. Its development has just begun. Norway, on the other hand, has been inhabited by the ancestors of the present population from time immemorial. Its population is one of the hardest and best races among the sons of men.

ALASKA AND NORWAY.
The climate of Alaska on all its southern coasts is, on the whole, milder than that of Norway. And the inhabitable area of Alaska is far greater. Norway has an area of 124,000 square miles, three-fourths uninhabitable. Alaska has an area of more than 500,000 square miles and has a habitable area of 120,000 square miles. Norway has a population of 2,292,000. This population occupies a territory scarcely exceeding 30,000 square miles. Almost the whole population is on the coast line. A lofty mountain chain, a little back from the coast, as in Alaska, cuts off the shore line from the interior. There is some agriculture, but, measured by our standards, not much. The principal industries are fishing, navigation, cattle raising, dairying and lumbering. In southern Norway agriculture is an important interest, but, breadstuffs are still imported.

In all the particulars above enumerated Alaska has resources greater than those of Norway, and mineral resources but, measured by our standards, the climates are similar, but that of Alaska milder. Taking Norway for judgment and for comparison, we believe that the time will come when Alaska will have 3,000,000 inhabitants and be one of the most important states of the American Union.
