



DEAD BREWER LEFT A GREAT ESTATE

Nolke Was Killed in an Automobile Accident Last Month.

ST. LOUIS, July 10.—The inventory of the estate of William F. Nolke, a wealthy brewer, who was killed in an automobile accident near Peoria, Ill., in June, was filed for probate today.

No schedule was furnished of real estate but the personal property amounted to over \$1,300,000. The widow of his son, Mrs. Eleanor Nolke, accompanied by Edwin A. Lemp, was out riding in an automobile last night when the machine ran over and killed Ernest Shank an electrician, who had just alighted from a street car on Easton avenue.

Mrs. Nolke, Mr. Lemp and the chauffeur, August Smith, were taken to the police station, and after telling their story, Mrs. Nolke and Mr. Lemp were permitted to go upon promise to appear at the coroner's inquest tomorrow. Smith was held pending the inquest.

"BURROS" COME TO GRIEF IN THE PHILIPPINES

WASHINGTON, July 10.—Sometime ago the insular bureau of the war department embarked upon the experiment of sending into the Philippines a few American donkeys, known as "burros" for use among the Spanish speaking people.

Mail advices from the island now state that seven, or about half, of the consignment were drowned in the torrential rains of the wet season.

The animals being caught in the open and not knowing how to shelter themselves like the native beasts of burden.

The natives, who were a little afraid of the animals, declared that the burros had become so tame that they did not have a sense enough to get in out of the rain.
