PARLIAMENT TO PASS TRADES DISPUTE BILL

Most Far-Reaching and Radical Piece of Legislation Ever Enacted in England.

It Confers Upon Trade Unions Right to Strike, Boycott and Influence Others.

LONDON, Feb. 21.—The British Parliament is about to pass the most radical and far-reaching piece of labor legislation that has ever been enacted in that country, known as "The Trades Bill."

The formation of this league heralded the complete effacement of the once powerful United Typothetae of America. Seventeen months ago the United Typothetae threw down the gauntlet to the International Typographical Union and invited a battle over the eight-hour day.

The draft of the constitution of the league was written by Henry W. Chevrone; of New York, one of the most widely known master printers in America.

The constitution vests the power to make collective contracts in a "Printers' Congress," composed of an equal number of employing and employed.

Provision is made for the division of the United States into fifteen printing districts. Each district will be entitled to three representatives in the Printers' Congress.
