EDITORS FOUND GUILTY OF LIBEL

Former Federation Official Indicted on Evidence of Lodge Custodian.

A. M. and G. E. Morrison editors of the Mankato Journal have been declared guilty of libel in a suit brought about by E. M. Lawless editor of the Waterville Sentinel.
