

States government. He concluded his speech by saying: "From what I have seen and heard here I can carry back to Washington the message that you are loyal and that you will stick."

A letter from George Creel, chairman of the United States bureau of public information, was read at the league convention.

"I have a feeling," Mr. Creel wrote to a league organizer, "that the work you are doing is extremely valuable in this crisis. Despite attacks, I believe intensely in the loyalty of the Nonpartisan league and have done all in my power to protect it from unfair assault."

Government's Friends Accused. It will be interesting to observe during the coming campaign how Governor Burnquist compares these views of Federal officials with his own view in refusing to welcome the league convention to St. Paul when he said it was a body including "Pro-Germans, lawless I. W. and Red Socialists."

And another thing the governor will have to tell about in the campaign is the street railway company in St. Paul and Minneapolis. The governor branded street car employees who decided to form a union as loyalists and he put his loyalty O. K. on the street railway company and officials.

AWAKE IN CUMBERLAND. CUMBERLAND, April 18.—Within the past year there have been 24 unions organized in the Cumberland district, which includes western Maryland and that part of West Virginia immediately adjacent to this city.

Unionists are holding community mass meetings in various sections of the district and their continued agitation is producing results.

CAMPAIGN ISSUE WILL BE SHAM OR REAL DEMOCRACY.

Lindbergh Will Contest With Burnquist for Republican Nomination for Governor.

ST. PAUL, Minn., April 18.—The nonpartisan league state ticket is led by C. A. Lindbergh, Little Falls, congressman from the Little Minnesota district for ten years.

From a political or any other standpoint the league could not have chosen stronger candidate than Mr. Lindbergh. He has a perfect record of fighting the people's battles throughout his public career.

In addition to an unswerving personal character and public record, Mr. Lindbergh has the advantages of being a powerful orator and one of the most successful campaigners who ever went to the stump.

This is the kind of opponent Governor Burnquist will meet. There is no question but that the governor will be the defensive throughout the campaign. It would take a campaign of several years' duration for him to have an explanation of the acts of his administration that are now under fire.

Defeated by Steel Trust. Opponents of Mr. Lindbergh will try to confuse the people by saying the masses rejected him two years ago when he ran for United States senator. He was defeated then by the steel trust, but he made a better run in perhaps any man in the state would have made under the circumstances.

He went into that campaign single-minded. He had no campaign fund of his own. He had no newspaper. He had no organization behind him and only was able to make a few speeches during the campaign.

This year it will be different. He is an organization of 45,000 organized workers behind him and they are backed up by nearly an equal number of organized laboring men.

Lindbergh Outlines Issue. The big issue of the campaign is the real democracy. Governor Burnquist has made the issue. He has asked his own battlefield. The situation is well summarized by Mr. Lindbergh, who says: "The profiteers and politicians, as perpetuated themselves in special privilege and in office; they endeavor change election rules fearing the 1 of the majority that they are in; they assume the acts and attitudes of those citizens who are only leaving to follow out their constitutional rights of political and economic organization and expression in legal, loyal and orderly way, guaranteed to them by the laws of the state and the nation, but which state officials have failed to uphold. By their failure to uphold and protect the people in these rights they have themselves created a most important issue in our state. "That issue is real democracy."
