

GRANTS 44-HOUR WEEK TO SILK MILL WORKERS

ARRANGE FOR WORLD'S CONFERENCE OF LABOR

SHAMOKIN, Pa., Aug. 14.—The J. P. and C. E. Eagle silk mills have granted the shorter hour demand of 3,000 employees after an 11-week strike. Wages are increased and the week is reduced from 63 1/2 to 48 hours. The company says it did not recognize the United Textile Workers' union, but the settlement was negotiated by officers of this union, who are assured that all strikers will be reinstated. The victory is one of the most decisive ever secured by workers in this vicinity.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 14.—The department of labor has appointed Miss Grace Abbott to assist the organization committee of the international labor conference which meets in London to arrange for the first conference at Washington, next October. The labor conference was created by the peace treaty. America's representative on the organization committee is Professor Shotwell of Columbia university, who is also assisted in London by Ethelbert Stewart of the department of labor.
