ON BOARD PRESIDENT HARDING'S SPECIAL TRAIN, Oct. 25.—On his way to Alabama to speak tomorrow at the Birmingham semi-centennial, President Harding today got his first real picture of the south since he became chief executive.

Most of the day his train travelled southward from Washington, the President watched from the window of his car the passing panorama of agricultural and industrial development and made many comments on the accomplishments and needs of the southern states. At several places southern products, including fruit and especially cured tobacco, were presented to him as an earnest of the section's hospitality.

ing been thrown into darkness early in the night, while in the business section electric lights were intermittently on and off. Beyond two small blazes in the residential section and minor auto accidents, the storm has had no ill consequences here so far as known.

As the storm turned sharply across

the state from the west to the east coast trees were uprooted and small buildings demolished while crops in the path were reported as being seriously damaged.

Division Superintendent Hurley, of the Seaboard Air Line railroad, with headquarters here, reported he had been in touch with the railway offices at Tampa for a few minutes tonight, and that several houses at that place were reported blown down while others were unroofed. The railroad tracks, he said, for several miles this side of Tampa, were inundated and the Seaboard trains were entering the city over the Atlantic Coast Line tracks.

Daytona In Darkness

Daytona, Oct. 25.—With a forty mile gale blowing from the south-east and a heavy rain falling the triple cities—Daytona, Seabreeze and Daytona Beach—are in darkness. The service was cut off to prevent damage of falling wires. Roofs of several houses in Daytona Beach and Seabreeze were lifted off, but no serious damage was reported. The Morning Journal was forced to suspend publication.

Mr. Hines declined to make any general comment on the situation or to discuss any specific points.

Unless the Railroad Labor Board has changed its attitude concerning the necessity of general chairmen of the five labor organizations appearing at the Chicago meeting it is anticipated that one of the first legal squabbles to be decided will be on the action of Warren S. Stone, president of the Engineers, in notifying his general chairmen they need not answer the Labor Board's citation. Mr. Stone announced tonight that only himself and six grand officers, in whom the authority of the organi-

zation is vested, will attend the conference.




