tion of leading citizens came to the train at 2 o'clock in the morning and begged Johnson's secretary to permit them to enter his car and gaze at the sleeping foe of Robin Hops and John Barleycorn. The request was granted and "Pussyfoot" did not know of the affair until breakfast. The night before, at 11:30 o'clock, Johnson's train pulled into Ajmer. About 500 natives were at the station and yelled for a speech. The crusader was awakened and as the stop was only for a few minutes he didn't have time to dress. Whereupon the American appeared on the platform in slippers and pajamas and gave the crowd a vehement if brief broadside against the drink evil. Baroda, governed by a native ruler, entertained "Pussyfoot" as a guest of the government. An entire mansion, with a coterie of servants and a chief of staff, and a carriage with driver and footman, were assigned to him and the reception was attended by Indian rapahs and princesses as well as officials of the state. Mr. Johnson later was entertained by the dramatic portrayal of an Indian folklore play and examples of native household worship. The national hymn was sung and flags were flying as he entered the province. He visited a social settlement and in the evening spoke to 3,000 at a pro-

Merced River Cut Through Mountain to Make Yosemite

(By Associated Press.) Yosemite, Cal., Oct. 27.—Out of the living granite of the Sierra Nevada mountains, the Merced river, hundreds of thousands of years ago, first cut the Yosemite valley, California's great outdoor playground. Dr. F. E. York, Matthes of the United States geological survey, declared here after returning from a recent three month exploration trip through the wild portions of the high Sierras. After the river made the first great glacier came along and the valley its finishing touches. Merced, Dr. Matthes claims, is a great V-shaped gorge, and the river added a few curves and corners to Yosemite into the U-shape it has at present. Dr. Matthes' beliefs form a contribution to the many theories regarding the origin of Yosemite. He has held this theory for some time and declared findings on his confirmed it. Accepted theories as to the formation of the Sierra Nevada mountains were strengthened by Dr. Matthes' observations on his trip. The theory is, he said, that a series of terrific upthrusts tilted the immense block of granite covering the mountain range. The highest peak in the Yosemite National park was lifted to its present height of more than 13,000 feet from a comparatively low elevation of 5,000 feet, it is thought. Dr. Matthes, on his trip, went into the southern Sierra Nevadas and covered practically the entire eastern watershed of the San Moquin river.

Football Immune to Tax in France

(By Associated Press.) Paris, Oct. 27.—Football matches in France henceforth, will not come under the heading of entertainments but within the category of "physical and military education." French courts have ruled. Hitherto gate receipts of football matches have been uniformly subjected to the so-called poor-tax on entertainments. A test case, however, has just been made by the manager of the Toulouse club who refused to turn in the usual ten percent to the state and the court has decided that football was immune from the tax.

hibition mass meeting presided over by the Prime Minister of Baroda. Ahmedabad, the great Indian manufacturing center, was next visited and after a series of social functions the American dry leader was taken to the home of Mahatma K. Gandhi. Speaking later before several hundred students of the National University, the president, faculty and student body of which were seated on the floor, Mr. Johnson made a good impression by refusing to accept a chair and, amid cheers, sat on the floor himself. In the evening a mass meeting was held in the town hall, the largest assemblage place in the city, which was able to accommodate not more than half of the people who calmed for admission.

The Thakor Sahib, ruler of Limbet, a feudal state which is independent of British rule, was the crusader's host at his palace the next day. The Thakor Sahib shut up the distillery and closed all the rum shops of his state and the Prime Minister of Bhavnagar, regent of a neighboring province, announced that on November 1 it would become dry.

A committee of 60 Delhi business men, followed by a crowd that completely jammed the railroad station, met Johnson upon his arrival here. It was with difficulty that the American and his secretary, Tarini Prasad Sinha, were able to reach their carriage through a cordon of police. Then followed three memorable days in which "Pussyfoot" jumped from one event to another. The largest open-air demonstration, in the rear of the city hall, was attended by 6,000 and was presided over by Pundit Madan Mohan Malviya, head of the great Hindu University at Benares. The Hindu intellectual leader travelled 400 miles to act as chairman of the meeting which presented Johnson with an address of welcome printed in two languages on Indian hand-woven cloth. Another gift from Delhi people was a gold and woven garland. Leaders of the Delhi demonstration included the head of the Khalfet movement in India, the political head of the Moslem church and Bishop Warner of America. Mr. Johnson was acclaimed by one of the speakers as "our brother who came 12,000 miles from America to help the people of India."

(By Associated Press.) Copenhagen, Oct. 27.—The Danish government in April appropriated 200,000 kroner to defray the expense of sending the ship, Teddy, to the east coast of Greenland to search for the East Greenland Trading Co.'s ship Dagny which had been dispatched from Copenhagen in the spring of 1920. Since then, nothing had been heard of her. A cablegram from Akreyri, Iceland, reports the safe arrival there of the Teddy. On July 17, she observed a distress signal on Walrus Island and sent a party across the ice to investigate. They discovered the Dagny's captain, Hansen, at Germanishaven station. It appears that the Dagny became iceblocked on August 8, 1920, 30 miles east of the Shannon Islands. Part of the crew had previously landed at some newly established stations, and the remainder had reached land on an ice floe. Before they were rescued by the Teddy, however, three of them perished, two succumbing to scurvy and the third being killed in an encounter with a polar bear. The Teddy, herself, was icebound from August 24 to September 2.

Yale's New Track to Be Last Word in Construction

New Haven, Conn., Oct. 27.—As the new running track for the Yale track men on Yale field nears completion, some of its features are apparent. The track is being constructed by the same men who built the bowl and, as in the case of the bowl certain things are claimed for it which are not possessed by any other track in the country. On the north side of this track will be an oval for the 440 yard run. The track's advantages over all others used for inter-collegiate is all starters will be on a straightaway.
