

PALS LOSE SECOND GAME TO WILD CAT SQUAD SAME SCORE

The hitting slump which struck the Pals several days before they left for Ocala is continuing, according to yesterday's score in the Brick City when they lost the second game to the Wild Cats by a score of 4 to 1. The surprise at these two losses was no greater in Palatka than in other sections of the state where the almost unbroken record made by the Pals has created such comment.

Results of these two games, however, should be taken as the fortunes of baseball. The ever present hazard is what makes the game popular, and the strongest club is sometimes defeated by the weakest in a league in successive games.

No club in the state, including those in the state league, show better hitting records than the local club, and with its superb outfield and fast infield, and an incomparable backstop, with a pitching staff that has been going good, fans can be very certain that the club will be back on its stride in a few days and will, no doubt, avenge the two games dropped to the Wild Cats. LAKE NEAR PARK

Lake Near Park is just what its name suggests—the nearest lake to Palatka. It was formerly known as Bohemia Park, or Wiggs Lake, on Francis Road. It is to be reopened under the management of Mr. and Mrs. Kennedy Watts, of East Palatka. It will be their aim to cater to the best people of Palatka. Sunday school and lodge picnics will be given extra inducements to make this the place of their outings.

Luncheons and afternoon teas will be served to parties of from eight to sixteen. Such parties will make arrangements with Mrs. Geo. Davis in Palatka. A special feature will be made of Thursday and Sunday night suppers. Menus will be published. The park will be open until 10:30 p. m., but no unchaperoned evening parties. No cards or dancing on Sunday.

The park to begin will consist of bath houses, restaurant, shade pavilions and public dining pavilions. Free camping grounds and swimming for Boy and Girl Scouts on week days except Thursday afternoon and evening. Work on buildings was started Thursday, June 8th, and is to be completed by the Fourth of July. Bath houses are being built first, so there will be swimming by next Thursday.

There is to be a regular bus to the park, leaving the courthouse, time to be published later.

Gold Knives Used to Carve Sacrifices.

At Chichen-Itza, in Yucatan, where there is a sacred sinking well, there has been found all sorts of beautiful sacrifices imbedded in the mud. Jade necklaces, gold plates and small jars heavily studded with jade, sometimes containing human hearts, have been found in this well. The Maya Indians made these sacrifices when they wanted rain or a blessing for their crops. Beautiful gold knives that were undoubtedly used to carve up the victims' sacrifice, usually young women, have also been found.

The Maya Indians of northern Yucatan probably use the same language as the builders of the ruins among which they live, says Prof. A. M. Tozzer, of Harvard university.

Lightning Flashes.

No doubt lightning flashes vary in thickness, but one photographed recently was estimated from the size of the trace it left on a photograph and the distance of the tower it struck from the camera, to be only one-fifth of an inch.

STOCK MARKET

New York, June 13.—Supporting orders checked the further general decline of prices at the opening of today's stock market, but the tone was very feverish and unsettled. Rallyies of one to almost two points in domestic and foreign oils, American Smelting, Union Pacific and Coca were offset by further reactions of 1 to 2.5-8 points in Vanadium, Chandler, Sumtra Tobacco, Stromberg Carburetor and several of the miscellaneous issues. The "merger" steels were hesitant, Republic advancing 1 point, while Midvale reached that much. Shippings were under further pressure, Mercantile Marine preferred falling 11-2 points. Foreign exchanges reflected nervous conditions abroad, with greater weakness in Austrian exchange on the closing of the bourse in that city.
