

TELEGRAPHIC.

MASSACHUSETTS STATE ELECTION.—BOSTON, Nov. 8.—The election for State officers was held to-day in this State, and passed off quietly.

The Republicans have elected their ticket by about the same majority as last year. Banks is elected Governor.

TRIAL OF THE HARPERS FERRY OUTLAW.—SPEIERS HANDED OVER TO THE FEDERAL AUTHORITIES. CHARLESTON, VA., Nov. 8.—The trial of Stephens, one of Old Brown's associates, was commenced to-day.

The Court was proceeding to empanel a jury, when a telegraphic despatch was received from Gov. Wise, suggesting to the prosecuting officer the propriety of allowing the Federal authorities to proceed against Stephens, in order to bring prominent Northern men, and some of the Abolition fanatics, who were cognizant of Brown's movements, as witnesses before the United States Court, the authorities of Virginia having no authority to summon witnesses from other States.

ARREST OF ANOTHER HARPERS FERRY OUTLAW.—MEMPHIS, Nov. 8.—W. R. Palmer, who is charged with having been an accessory in the late Harper's Ferry riot, was arrested here to-day. He is confined in the city jail awaiting a requisition from Gov. Wise.

GOVERNMENT AID FOR BROWNVILLE.—WASHINGTON, Nov. 9.—Mr. Floyd, the Secretary of War, has ordered Pickett's command of artillery at Baton Rouge to make preparations to march to Brownville at the earliest notice, to act as a protection to the citizens of that place from the depredations of Corinas and his band of guerrillas. The Secretary of War has also given orders to the Quartermaster at New Orleans to provide transportation for the troops from Baton Rouge to Point Isabel, on the Texas coast.

GERRIT SMITH GONE CRAZY.—UTICA, N. Y., Nov. 9.—Gerrit Smith was brought to the Lunatic Asylum in this city to-day, having become seriously deranged (C).

THE GREAT SOUTHERN MAIL.—WASHINGTON, Nov. 9.—Postmaster General Holt returned to Washington to-day from his visit to his brother-in-law at Charleston, but has not yet opened the bids for carrying the mails from Portland to Orleans.

SENTENCE COMMITTED.—WASHINGTON, Nov. 9.—The President has commuted the sentence of Capt. Holmes, of Maine, who had been convicted of murder at sea.

ARRIVAL OF THE OVERLAND MAIL.—ST. LOUIS, Nov. 10.—The California Overland mail has arrived at this place, bringing San Francisco dates to the 17th ult.

Lieut. General Scott has arrived at San Francisco from Panama, and has been enthusiastically received by the citizens of that place.

Lieut. Mowry, the elected delegate to Congress from Arizona, came as a passenger.

He reports that various depredations had been committed by the Indians at the different mail stations along the route.

NEW YORK ELECTIONS.—NEW YORK, Nov. 11.—The latest returns of the election in this State indicate that the Republican State ticket is elected by about 5000 majority.

The election sanctions the formation of a floating canal debt, to the extent of \$2,500,000 of 6 per cent. stock, redeemable in 1875.

NEW JERSEY ELECTION.—TRENTON, N. J., Nov. 11.—Olden's majority for Governor is 2000.

In the Senate the Democrats have four majority, in the House of Assembly the Opposition have two majority, leaving a Democratic majority of two on joint ballot.

THE ELECTION IN KANSAS.—LEAVENWORTH CITY, Nov. 11.—The Republicans have gained a majority in both branches of the State Legislature.

The Leavenworth and Denver City express has arrived from Denver, bringing dates to the 3d inst., and \$20,000 in gold sent on consignment. The express brings favorable accounts from the mines, stating that they were yielding largely, and that the miners are in a healthy condition. The Utah mail has also arrived here, bringing dates from Salt Lake City to the 21st ult. The news is generally unimportant.

HEALTH OF SENATOR DOUGLASS.—WASHINGTON, Nov. 11.—Senator Douglas has again been taken with a severe relapse of his disease, and his condition is now considered a dangerous one.

UNITED STATES TREASURY.—WASHINGTON, Nov. 11.—The United States Treasury receipts for the last week amount to \$819,000. The amounts in the Treasury subject to draft is \$1,741,000.

THE WISCONSIN STATE ELECTION.—MILWAUKEE, Wis., Nov. 11.—The returns of the State election are not incomplete, though it is probable the entire Republican ticket is elected.

THE ELECTION IN ILLINOIS.—CHICAGO, Nov. 9.—The returns of the election in this city shows that the Republicans have a majority of 615 over their opponents. The returns of the election in Sangamon county give McClelland, the Democratic candidate for Congress in the Sixth District, a majority of 500.
