That from and after the promulgation of an Ordinance to be passed here-nnder, and in conformity to an Act No. 110 of the General Assembly of 1880. all that portion of territory lying on Rad River, in the Parish of Rapides, and within the following limits. to-wit : Commencing at the Month of to-wit: Commencing at the Mouth of Bayon Rapides, up said Bayon to Month of Bayon Coulie, up Bayon Coulie to the crossing of the New Or-leans and Pacific Railroad thereon, along the said Railroad to the point where Jackson street of said Town, it continued in a direct line would intersect said road, thence along said line to Tenth street, thence down Tenth street to where it would intersect the lane between Irving and Watts, if pio jected, thence up said lane to Red River, and up said river to point of starting, shall form a Corporation and body politic by the name of the City of Alexandria, and as such shall bave perpetual succession, and all the in-habitants thereof shall form a body corporate under the name and style of the Mayor and Conneil of the City of Alexandria, and by that name they and their successors shall be known in law, and be compelled to sue and be sued, plead and implead, defend and be defended in all Courts and places whatever, and in all manner of ac tions and whatsoever, also to hold, purchase, receive, possess, enjoy and retain to them and their successors all and every kind of property whatso-ever. Provided, the same be for ma-nicipal purposes, and the same sell, transfer, alien and lease from and dispose of, and may have and use a comion seal, and may alter and change the same at pleasure.

Second Proposed Amendment.

read as follows, to-wit That the May-or and Council shall have power to provide for the punishment of va-grants and disorderly persons, who may be found in the day or night time disturbing the public peace by fine not to exceed Fifty Dollars, and imprisonment not to exceed ten days, and that any person incuring un-der the Ordinances of said City, may be compelled to work on the streets of said Cify, at the rate of One Dollar per diem, until said fine and costs are paid.

Third Proposed Amendment -Amend Section 12 of said Act by inserting therein, in the fourth line of said section, and immediately following the word "hire" and before the word "before," as therein written, the following words: "Attorneys at law, physicians, dentiste, trades and occupations now paying liceuse tax under State law. circuses or travelling shows of any na ture or kind.


