ALEXANDRIA, LA., June 7, 1883.

The Police Jury met pursuant to adjournment. Present--

- F Seip, President, John A. Dixon, H. F. Long, J. W. Glass, Geo. L. Wilson, Jas. P. Hickman, F. A. Bianchari, A. Heyman, J. Y. Hathorn, S. D. Williams.

The minutes of the previous day were read and approved.

On motion of Mr. Long action on the claim of Mr. B. Cooper for old indebtedness, was postponed for want of time to a future meeting of this Jury.

On motion of Mr. Long, Whereas, Mr. Heyman was instructed at the February meeting of this Jury to insure the Court House and Public School buildings for the benefit of this Parish; and

Whereas, there was a statement in one of Town papers to the effect that it was thought an injustice had been done our citizens by insuring the above property at a cost of four hundred and forty-one dollars and sixty-seven cents, (\$441.67) when it could have been done for three hundred and fifty (\$350) dollars; and

Whereas, upon a thorough investigation of the whole subject Mr. Heyman has made a full and explicit statement of the whole transaction, and also showed the Jury papers which clearly exonerate him; and Whereas, Mr. Heyman has paid the Parish the rebate and commissions as he guaranteed he would do when he was instructed to insure the property, amounting to ninety-two dollars (\$92.75) and seventy five cents; therefore be it

Resolved, That we take pleasure in being able to say that all the charges against him are without any foundation at all, and that we find he has worked faithfully and truly for the good of the Parish of Rapides. On motion the Jury adjourned until 2 o'clock P. M.

2 O'Clock P. M. The Jury met pursuant to adjournment. Present: All the members at the morning session.

On motion of Mr. Williams, Resolved, That the report of the Finance Committee be accepted, and a committee be appointed to destroy all vouchers found to have been paid by the Treasurer, which was done, and they were destroyed.

On motion of Mr. Long, Resolved, That the sum of Two Hundred and Fifty dollars be appropriated out of the Contingent Fund of 1883, for the purpose of paying a Surveyor to locate and describe entered lands in this Parish so that the Assessor can place said lands on the assessment lists of this Parish, there being a very large quantity of land that has never been assessed on account of the impossibility of the Assessor to properly locate and describe them. Be it further

Resolved, That the President of this Jury is authorized to contract to have the work done and when completed to draw a warrant on the Treasurer of this Parish to pay for the same when there are funds in the Treasury for this purpose.

On motion of Mr. Long, Resolved, That from and after this date any party or parties who may purchase cattle in this Parish with the intention of taking them out of the Parish, shall before doing so be required to take the marks and brands of every one purchased, and whether male or female, with an approximation of their age and date of purchase, and to keep a record of the names of the party or parties of whom he has purchased them, and shall deposit a list as above enumerated, sworn to by the purchaser to be correct with the Recorder of this Parish, before attempting to take them out of this Parish. Be it further

Resolved, That any person engaged in the transportation of stock cattle, whether by boat or railroad, shall be required to have a copy of the above mentioned list, certified to by the Recorder of this Parish, that the original list is on file in his office, before receiving any cattle for shipment and any neglect to observe or obey the above resolution by either purchaser or carrier shall be considered a misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine of not less than Fifty nor more than Two Hundred dollars, said fine to be imposed by any Court of competent jurisdiction.

The following estimate of expenses of the Parish of Rapides for the year 1883 was made:

The Treasurer's Report shows cash on hand, \$5860.95, and indebtedness of the Parish as per Register \$3791.89. Claims examined and approved by the Finance Committee amount to \$366.63.
