PROCEEDINGS OF POLICE JURY.

ALEXANDRIA, LA., April 1, 1889.

The Police Jury met pursuant to adjournment. Present: C. J. Barstow, President; and Messrs. Butler, Griffin, Lawrence, Swann, J. W. Texada and L. M. Texada.

The minutes of the last day of last meeting were read and approved.

On motion of Mr. Swann: Resolved, That the following road hands be placed on road district No. 5, 2nd division, Hineston Ward, viz: James Crawford, Joseph Crawford, J. L. Powell and Son, Ed. Dove, Chas. Whitehurst, T. T. Marler, Chas. Dove, Howell Dove and George Cook.

On motion of Mr. Swann: Resolved, That the following road hands be placed on road district No. 11, Hineston Ward, viz: Thomas Holt, Kirkpatrick, D. W. Walker, Wm. Marler, T. Koons and Thomas Crawford.

On motion of Mr. J. W. Texada: Resolved, That the attention of Allen Brasher be and is hereby called to the dangerous condition of Billy Bayou Bridge, recently built by him, said bridge not having been extended far enough on the banks when constructed, and he is hereby notified to remedy the defect immediately, or it will be done at his expense by the parish.

On motion of Mr. Carruth: Resolved, That the report of the commissioners appointed to estimate the value of the work done on Blunt's creek bridge be received and accepted, and the contractors bill be approved for ten dollars.

On motion of Mr. J. W. Texada: Resolved, That the report of the committee appointed at last meeting of this Jury, to examine and investigate in whose title the public school houses in the town of Alexandria is recorded, be received and accepted, and that said report be published in the official journal of the parish in these proceedings.

Report of Committee:

ALEXANDRIA, LA., April 1, 1889.

To Hon. Calvin J. Barstow, President Police Jury, and Members of the Police Jury, Rapides Parish, Louisiana.—Being chairman of the Committee to look into the sale of the lots of ground, upon which the Public School Houses are situated, I have the honor to make the following report, viz: I find recorded in Conveyance Book "C," pages 597 and 598, an act of sale from Thompson Copley to Geo. Y. Kelson, President of School Board and John Delacy, Secretary of same, of the following described property: Square No. 53, of the Town of Alexandria, as per map made by R. W. Bringhurst, Parish Surveyor; price and consideration, \$500 cash in hand paid, as per act passed before V. W. Porter, Recorder and Ex-officio Notary Public, of date Sept. 26th, 1873, and of record, Sept. 26th, 1873, deed and titled warranted.

ALEXANDRIA, LA., April 1, 1889.

Capt. C. J. Barstow, President Police Jury, Dear Sir: The title to the "Public School Property" in Alexandria is in the Board of School Directors, of this Parish. It has never been transferred to the Parish. The Police Jury, therefore, is not the custodian thereof, nor in any way responsible therefor. I very much doubt if any responsibility ever did rest with it; but if such was the case, Sec. 7, of Act. 81, of 1888, settles the matter by expressly providing that the "School Boards may receive land by purchase or donation for the purpose of erecting school-houses, provide for and secure the erection of same, construct such outbuildings and enclosures as shall be conducive to the protection of the property, make repairs and provide the necessary furniture and apparatus."

This certainly fixes the custodianship and repairs of the property in question on the School Directors of this Parish. The title being there also, I conclude that the Parish has no legal responsibility for either the preservation or repair of said property.

On motion of Mr. Butler: Resolved, That J. B. Laird be appointed syndic on road district No. 14, from B. Meyer's place on Lamourie to Lantianier, vice W. B. Laird; that Chas. L. Hardy be appointed syndic in road district No. 5, from Lecompte to Lamourie bridge, vice E. V. Weems; that Joe Beauregard be appointed syndic on road district No. 12, from mouth of Dunn's bayou through lower Kansas to river at parish line, vice Geo. C. Smith; and that J. Z. Perry be appointed syndic on road district No. 13, from Lecompte to Lamourie, vice Oran Dorsett; and James Webb, on district No. 2, lower half, from Pantis' to Duau's bayou, vice G. L. Wilson, all of Lamourie Ward.

On motion of Mr. Carruth: Resolved, That the public road leading from Westport to Bethel church, be changed, provided it be done without expense to the parish, so as to intersect with the public road leading from Sugartown, at the parish line of Calcasieu near the Henson neighborhood.

On motion of Mr. Carruth: Resolved, That the road leading from Mike Smith's mill to Strother's crossing, on Calcasieu, now having been opened without expense to the parish, be and the same is hereby declared a public road, and the hands on the Strother road be and the same are hereby transferred to said road, and L. M. Nichols appointed syndic thereof.

On motion of Mr. Texada: Resolved, That the President of the Police Jury and the Finance Committee be authorized to effect the renewal of the insurance on the court house and jail.

The Police Jury met pursuant to adjournment. Present: C. J. Barstow, President; and Messrs. Butler, Carruth, Flower, Griffin, Lawrence, Randolph, Swann, J. W. Texada, and L. M. Texada.

The minutes of yesterday were read and approved.

On motion of Mr. Randolph: Resolved, That the sum of \$65, or as much thereof as may be necessary, be appropriated out of the bridge fund of 1889, to build extensions to the Big Slough bridge on the East side of Calcasieu river, at the Davis crossing, and that Sol Strother, Carrol Johnson, Sr., and Jos. Wingard be appointed commissioners to let out said work according to law.

On motion of Mr. Randolph: Resolved, That the sum of \$25 be appropriated out of the pauper fund of 1889 for the relief of Joseph Wilson, an indigent person, and that B. Pressburg be appointed his disbursing agent.

On motion of Mr. Butler: Resolved, That the sum of \$25 be appropriated out of the pauper fund of 1889, for the relief of Lavice Randel, an indigent person, and that E. B. Pendleton be appointed her disbursing agent.

On motion of Mr. Butler: Resolved, That J. J. Goffe be appointed levee guard on levee districts No. 2 and 3, with full power to enforce the State law relative to same, namely to kill all hogs running at large on levees and keep all trees, briars and undergrowth cut off, and that he be paid the sum of \$200 per annum for same, payable quarterly.

On motion of Mr. Butler: Resolved, That the bills of J. J. Goffe be approved for levee district No. 2 and 3.

On motion of Mr. Rutler: Resolved, That the sum of \$25 be appropriated out of the pauper fund of 1889 for the relief of Annie Morton, an indigent person, and that Joe Cruse be appointed her disbursing agent.

Resolved, further, that the sum of \$25 be appropriated out of the pauper fund of 1889, for the relief of Mary Williams, an indigent person, and that A. V. Cox be appointed her disbursing agent.

Resolved, further, That the sum of \$25 be appropriated out of the pauper fund of 1889, for the relief of Mary Anne Williams, an indigent person, and that A. V. Cox be appointed her disbursing agent.

On motion of Mr. Butler: Resolved, That the sum of \$450, or as much thereof as may be necessary, be appropriated out of the bridge fund of 1889, to repair the bridge across Bayou Bertrand, and that H. P. Luckett, A. Marye, and Jere Williams be and are hereby appointed commissioners to let out and receive the same according to law.

On motion of Mr. J. W. Texada: Resolved, That the sum of \$25, or as much thereof as may be necessary, be appropriated out of the bridge fund of 1889, to repair the flooring of Texada bridge, on Bayou Rapides, and that P. J. Sleet, M. J. Dunnam and James Cruikshank be and are hereby appointed commis-

sioners to let out and receive the same.

On motion of Mr. J. W. Texada: Resolved, That Jesse Iles, syndic on road district No. 3, Rapides Ward, be instructed to notify the owners of the hedges encroaching upon the public road in his district, to remove the same at once, failing to do so after a fifteen days' notification, he is hereby instructed to remove the same at their expense, and present bill to this Jury for payment.

On motion of Mr. Flower: Resolved, That the sum of \$500, or as much thereof as may be necessary, be appropriated out of the general fund of 1889, for the purpose of making necessary repairs and needed improvements on the Court house, and that W. F. Blackman, Geo. O. Watts and D. T. Stafford be appointed a committee to have said work done.

On motion of Mr. Flower: Resolved, That the sum of \$25, be appropriated out of the pauper fund of 1889, for the relief of Catherine Washington, an indigent person, and that E. H. McCormick be appointed her disbursing agent.

On motion of Mr. Swann: Resolved, That a committee be appointed to wait upon Mr. R. W. Bringhurst, Parish Surveyor, and ascertain from him about what will be the probable cost of making a map of the parish, according to Act. No. 38 of 1884.

The President appointed Messrs. Swann, Texada and Lawrence.

On motion of Mr. Randolph: Whereas, Geo. O. Watts, has appeared before this Jury and has shown that he has paid \$19.72 parish taxes, and has further shown that the same has been collected in error, the same having been paid by other parties, Therefore, be it Resolved, That the Tax Collector is hereby directed to deduct the amount of \$19.72 from the amount of parish taxes due from the said G. O. Watts.

On motion of Mr. Texada: Whereas, The public road between Smith and Graham's and Graham and Stafford has been disused and almost unfit for public travel for the past four or five years, and that the public necessity requires that the said road be put in condition for public travel, Therefore, be it Resolved, That the sum of \$150, or as much thereof as may be necessary, be appropriated out of the general fund of 1889, to be expended in making the said road one fit for public travel, and that C. R. Haworth, Percy Taylor and Jesse Iles be and are hereby appointed commissioners, to expend said sum to the best advantage.

Mr. Griffin in the chair.

On motion of Mr. Barstow: Resolved, That the appropriation of \$50, made at a former meeting of this Jury, to repair Cheneyville bridge, being insufficient for said repairs, the further sum of \$20, is hereby appropriated out of the bridge fund of 1889, for the repair of said bridge.

On motion of Mr. Barstow: Resolved, That all persons having stock ditches, or other deep ditches across public roads, be, and they are hereby directed to bridge them the full width of the road or substantially fence said ditches on both sides of same, so as to effectually prevent any person riding, driving, or walking, from running or falling into said ditch. That it shall be the duty of road syndics, to notify parties owning the land to comply with this resolution, within ten days after service of notice, and in case of failure to comply with said notification the syndic shall have said work done immediately in a substantial manner, presenting bill of cost to this Jury for payment.

That it shall be the duty of the District Attorney to at once enter suit against the owners of the land for collection of same.

Whereas, A petition of citizens of Cheneyville and vicinity has been presented to this Jury setting forth the bad and almost impassible condition of the road for pedestrians from the depot at Theoda to Cheneyville during the wet season of the year, and that the said bad condition frequently prevents passengers and prospectors laying over at that point from visiting Cheneyville and other points on Bayou Boeuf, and that they thus receive a very unfavorable opinion of the country, and further that this bad condition of the road prevents children from attending the schools, public and private, and churches at Cheneyville; Therefore be it Resolved, That the sum of \$200, or as much thereof as may be necessary, be appropriated out of the general fund of 1889, to make a plank walk from the railroad depot at Theoda to the banks of Bayou Boeuf, at the old Roberts House, and that Sam Blum, D. Levy and E. H. Jackson, are appointed commissioners to let out and superintend and receive said work.

The President resuming the chair. On motion the Jury adjourned until 10 o'clock to-morrow morning to enable the Finance Committee to settle with the Treasurer.

The Police Jury met pursuant to adjournment. Present: C. J. Barstow, President; and Messrs. Butler, Carruth, Flower, Griffin, Lawrence, Randolph, Swann, J. W. Texada and L. M. Texada.

The minutes of yesterday were read and approved.

On motion of Mr. Griffin: Resolved, That the sum of \$25 be appropriated out of the pauper fund of 1889, for the relief of Louisa

Antoine, an indigent person, and that G. W. Bolton be appointed her disbursing agent. Resolved further, That the sum of \$25 be appropriated out of the pauper fund of 1889, for the relief of Talita Rice, an indigent person, and that Robert Aaron be appointed her disbursing agent.

On motion of Mr. Lawrence: Resolved, That the sum of \$25, be appropriated out of the pauper fund of 1889, for the relief of J. J. Davenport, an indigent person, and that G. W. Bolton be appointed his disbursing agent.

On motion of Mr. Flower: Resolved, That the sum of \$300, or as much thereof as may be necessary, be appropriated out of the general fund of 1889, to repair the plank road on the Bayou Robert road, and that Wm. Harris, Thomas Clements and D. S. Flower be and they are hereby appointed commissioners to have said work done.

On motion of Mr. Randolph: Resolved, That the syndic from Butler's gin to Dentley creek, be, and is hereby empowered to work the road as established by the Police Jury in the original survey granted by the Police Jury in 1885, and that any one obstructing said road shall be subject to indictment as the law directs.

On motion the Jury adjourned until 9 o'clock to-morrow morning to enable the Finance Committee to go into the examination of claims.

ALEXANDRIA, LA., April 5th, 1889.

The Police Jury met pursuant to adjournment. Present: C. J. Barstow, President; Messrs. Butler, Carruth, Flower, Griffin, Lawrence, Randolph, Swann, J. W. Texada and L. M. Texada.

The minutes of yesterday were read and approved.

On motion of Mr. Butler: Resolved, That the sum of \$25, or as much thereof as may be necessary, be appropriated out of the bridge fund of 1889, for the repair of the bridge on the public road in front of Mrs. Clara Smith's place, and that L. E. Smith, — Britt and Chas. Hardy be appointed a committee to let out and receive same according to law.

On motion of Mr. Randolph: Resolved, That the sum of \$25 be appropriated out of the pauper fund of 1889 for the relief of Hall Baines, an indigent person, and that H. P. Penninger be appointed his disbursing agent.

On motion of Mr. Flower: Resolved, That from and after the publication of the proceedings of the meeting of the Jury, the Sheriff, D. T. Stafford, be authorized to take out prisoners confined in parish jail to work on public roads, and that the sum of \$1.25 per day be appropriated out of the general fund of 1889 to pay for a guard for guarding said prisoners while they are at work.

On motion of Mr. Swann: Resolved, That it shall not be lawful for any one to travel the public roads of this parish with uncaged bears or other wild animals, other than those belonging to and accompanying regularly organized and licensed shows or menageries; any person so doing shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction thereof before any Justice of the Peace of the Parish, shall be fined or imprisoned, or suffer both, not to exceed fifty dollars or thirty days, said bear or other animal to be subject to be killed if in the opinion of the Justice of the Peace the public safety demands it.

On motion of Mr. Lewis Texas: Whereas, a petition of the Cottle Ward has been presented to the Jury asking for an appropriation to build a bridge across Bayou Verron, Therefore, be it Resolved, That M. C. Mosely, Dr. Alfred Goode and K. L. Carusian be appointed commissioners to select the most suitable place for a bridge across said bayou, and also to make an estimate of what it will cost the parish, and also if the public necessity requires the bridge.

On motion of Mr. Carruth: Resolved, That the report of the committee appointed by the President of the Police Jury to confer with the parish surveyor and ascertain what will be the cost of making map and abstracts of land in the parish of Rapides, in compliance with Act 38, of 1884, of the Legislature of Louisiana, be received, and the committee be discharged.

On motion of Mr. Griffin: Whereas, the Board of Directors of the Soldier's Home of Louisiana have made an appeal for assistance in which they show that the institution is greatly in need of funds to continue its charitable work for the year, Therefore, be it Resolved, That the sum of \$150 be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the general fund of 1889, as a donation from the parish of Rapides to that institution.

Mr. Griffin in the chair. On motion of Mr. Barstow: Resolved, That Jos. Fitzpatrick be appointed syndic on road district No. 8, from Bayou Boeuf to Bayou Cocodrie, in place of T. E. Brown who served last year.

The President resuming the chair. On motion of Mr. Butler: Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Rapides in regular session convened: That the said Parish of Rapides, until otherwise ordained by the Police Jury, shall be, and the same is hereby divided into two levee wards or districts to be known and designated as Levee District No. 1 and No. 2.

Be it further ordained: That Levee District No. 1 shall embrace and include within its jurisdiction all the public levees commencing at the upper line of the levee on or at the

Hynson property, on the South or East side of the Bayou Rapides, thence down the levee down said bayou to its intersection with the levee on Red river, and thence down the levee on or along the South side of Red River to the Choctaw bayou, about 12 miles below the town of Alexandria.

That Levee District No. 2 shall embrace and include within its jurisdiction all the public levees on the South side of Red River, commencing at the upper side of Choctaw bayou, about twelve miles below the town of Alexandria, and extending down the said levee to the point or line dividing the parishes of Rapides and Avoyelles.

Be it further ordained That William Harris is hereby appointed levee overseer of all the public levees embraced and included in Levee District No. 1; and that George L. Wilson is hereby appointed levee overseer of all the public levees embraced and included in Levee District No. 2, as created by this ordinance.

Be it further ordained That the levee overseers in the said districts Nos. 1 and 2, be, and they are hereby specially required and authorized to enforce the provisions of the law in reference to the protection, preservation and repair of the public levees in their respective districts as provided for in Act No. 84, Session Acts 1884; and that they shall have the full right and authority to require the road syndics along the line of levee in their respective districts to work the roads and the levees in conformity with the said Act of the Legislature; and in conformity also with the resolutions or ordinances passed by the Police Jury on the same subject matter.

Be it further ordained, That all road syndics in the said levee districts of Rapides parish shall work the public roads and levees in such way and manner as the levee overseers may direct, and particularly in such manner as will preserve and protect and keep in repair the levees, and as the law provides.

Be it further ordained, That the levee overseers in said districts shall be required to report any and all syndics who shall refuse or neglect to work the roads and public levees as provided for by law and the ordinances of the Police Jury on that subject matter.

Be it further ordained, That the resolution of the Police Jury of Aug. 14, 1887, and all laws in conflict with this, be, and the same are hereby repealed.

On motion of Mr. Flower: Resolved, That the sum of \$342.76, or as much thereof as may be necessary, be appropriated out of the general fund of the year 1889, for the purpose of purchasing two Lamborn Road Working Machines to be used in working the public roads throughout the parish.

Be it further Resolved, That M. J. Duham and Jos. H. Meeker, be and they are hereby appointed custodians of the said machines.

Be it further Resolved, That the custodians of said road working machines be authorized, and are hereby instructed to notify syndics, in answer to demands by said syndics in the wards where machines are being used, the day or date they can obtain said machine; and it shall be the duty of said custodians to require the syndics where and to whom they are to deliver them, immediately after completion of work in their district.

On motion, W. P. Flower was directed to purchase the above mentioned machines.

On motion the Jury then adjourned until 10 o'clock to-morrow morning.

The Police Jury met pursuant to adjournment. Present: C. J. Barstow, President; and Messrs. Butler, Carruth, Flower, Griffin, Lawrence, Randolph, Swann, J. W. Texada and L. M. Texada.

The minutes of yesterday were read and approved.

Mr. Randolph in the chair. On motion of Mr. Barstow: Resolved, That U. H. Johns, Inspector of Weights and Measures for the Parish of Rapides, is hereby authorized to purchase the implements necessary for him to fulfill the duties of his office, and present bill of same to this Jury for payment.

The President resuming the chair. On motion of Mr. Randolph: Resolved, That this Police Jury hereby reenact and declares the ordinance compiled by L. C. Sanford, Clerk Police Jury, as directed to be done by ordinance passed January 10, 1889, to be the local laws of Rapides Parish.

On motion of Mr. Flower: Resolved, That the sum of \$25 be appropriated out of the pauper fund of 1889 for the relief of Eliza Hamilton, an indigent person, and that Charles Mites be appointed his disbursing agent.

On motion of Mr. Swann: Resolved, That the President of the Police Jury be authorized to appoint a committee to contract with R. W. Bringhurst to make a map and abstracts of lands in the Parish of Rapides in compliance with Act. No. 38, of 1884.

The total cost of said map and abstracts shall not exceed the sum of Fifteen Hundred Dollars, payable as follows: Five Hundred Dollars on the delivery of said map and abstracts January 1st, 1890; Two Hundred Dollars on the 1st day of January 1891; Two Hundred Dollars on the 1st day of January 1892; Two Hundred Dollars on the 1st day of January, 1893; Two Hundred Dollars on the 1st day of January, 1894; Two Hundred Dollars on the first day of January, 1895.

The said R. W. Bringhurst agreeing to make such changes in said map and abstracts as shall be necessary for each year for the term of five years from the completion of said map and abstracts.

The President appointed Messrs. Swann, J. W. Texada, and Butler.

On motion of Mr. Flower: Resolved, That the sum of \$100 be appropriated out of the general fund of 1888, to pay the Returning Officer, G. A. Staples, for holding and making returns of Congressional and Presidential elections for the year 1888.

Resolved, That road syndics throughout the parish be, and they are hereby authorized and empowered to take the road hands off the public road to do any and all work that may be necessary to improve and put in good condition for public travel the road that said hands may be appointed to work, and any road hand refusing to obey such order, when properly required, shall be subject to same penalty as now fixed by law for refusal to work on the public roads.

On motion of Mr. Butler: Resolved, That the limits of all public ferries in the Parish of Rapides shall be two miles either way up and down stream from the point of crossing, or the point mentioned and set forth by the lease contract. And it shall be unlawful for any person to in any manner interfere with the privilege of the lessee of any public ferry within the said limits by crossing for hire any person, stock, parcels, vehicles or merchandise.

Be it further Resolved, That this ordinance shall not be construed to include or embrace within its provisions any person keeping boats for private use of himself or family.

Be it further Resolved, That this ordinance shall take effect from and after its publication.

On motion of Mr. Lawrence: Resolved, That the report of the Finance Committee be accepted and a committee appointed to burn all vouchers turned in by the Treasurer as paid, which was done, and the vouchers were burned.

The committee appointed to wait upon Mr. R. W. Bringhurst and make a contract with him for maps and abstracts of lands, submitted a contract which was approved and accepted.

On motion of Mr. Lawrence: Resolved, That the sum of \$50 be appropriated out of the general fund of 1889, to pay L. C. Sanford for compiling the parish laws.

On motion the Jury then adjourned until the 1st Monday in July next.
