A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS a treaty between the United States of America and Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland was concluded and signed by their plenipotentiaries at Washington on the fifth day of June last, which treaty...

ARTICLE I.

From the point of the forty-ninth parallel of north latitude, where the boundary laid down in existing treaties and conventions between the United States and Great Britain terminates, the line of boundary between the territories of the United States and Great Britain shall be as follows...

ARTICLE II.

From the point at which the forty-ninth parallel of north latitude shall be found to intersect the great northern branch of the Columbia river, the navigation of the said branch shall be free and open to the Hudson Bay Company and to all British subjects...

ARTICLE III.

In the future appropriation of the territory south of the forty-ninth parallel of north latitude, the present rights of the Hudson Bay Company, and of all British subjects who may be already in the occupation of land or other property lawfully acquired...

ARTICLE IV.

The farms, lands, and other property of every description belonging to the Puget's Sound Agricultural Company on the north side of the Columbia river, shall be confirmed to the said company.

ARTICLE V.

The present treaty shall be ratified by the President of the United States, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate thereof, and by Her Majesty the Queen of Great Britain, by and with the advice and consent of the Privy Council of Great Britain...

Whereas a treaty was made and concluded at the Agency on the Missouri river, near Council Bluffs, on the fifth day of June, and at Pottawatomie creek, near the Osage river, south and west of the State of Missouri, on the seventeenth day of the same month...

ARTICLE I.

Whereas the various bands of the Pottawatomie Indians, known as the Chippewas, Ottawas, and Shawanones, the Pottawatomies of the Prairie, and the Pottawatomies of the Potomac, and the Pottawatomies of Indiana, have, subsequent to the year 1828, entered into separate and distinct treaties with the United States...
