Organization of the Executive Departments of the Government of the United States.

DEPARTMENT OF STATE.
The whole machinery employed to conduct the business of the department is organized as follows: One Secretary of State, (William Hunter), one chief clerk, one translator, and one librarian.

First Auditor's Office.

Thomas L. Smith, esq., First Auditor, and nineteen clerks. He receives and adjusts the accounts of the customs revenue and disbursements...

Second Auditor's Office.

Philip Clayton, esq., Second Auditor, and twenty-one clerks. He receives and adjusts all accounts relating to the clothing, recruiting, and other accounts...

Third Auditor's Office.

Robert J. Atkinson, esq., Third Auditor, and twenty-eight clerks. He receives and adjusts all accounts for subsistence of the army, fortifications, military arsenals, military roads, and the Quartermaster's department...

Fourth Auditor's Office.

Aaron O. Dayton, esq., Fourth Auditor, and sixteen clerks. He receives and adjusts all accounts for the service of the Navy Department, and reports the balances to the Second Comptroller for his decision thereon.
