BY AUTHORITY. Resolution Proposing Amendments to the Constitution of THE COMMONWEALTH.

SECTION 1. Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, That the following amendments be and the same are hereby proposed to the Constitution of the Commonwealth...

SECTION 2. The aggregate amount of debts hereafter contracted by the Commonwealth shall never exceed the sum of five hundred thousand dollars, except in case of war to repel invasions, suppress insurrections, or to redeem the public debt of the Commonwealth...

SECTION 3. The credit of the Commonwealth shall not be diminished in any way by the issue of any paper money, or the issue of any bonds, or the issue of any other financial instrument...

SECTION 4. The Commonwealth shall never assume the debts of any county, city, borough or township, or of any corporation or association, unless such debts shall have been contracted to repel invasion, suppress insurrection, or to defend the State in war...

SECTION 5. The Legislature shall never authorize any county, city, borough or township, by vote of its citizens or otherwise, to become a stockholder in any joint stock company, association or corporation, or to raise money, or loan its credit to, or in aid of any such company or association...

SECTION 6. The Legislature shall never authorize any county, city, borough or township, by vote of its citizens or otherwise, to become a stockholder in any joint stock company, association or corporation, or to raise money, or loan its credit to, or in aid of any such company or association...
