Milk Cows and Young Cattle.

These should all have the advantage of warm, well ventilated stables or dry sheds; be cleanly and comfortable kept; have full supplies of food, and receive, at least twice a week, an ounce or two of salt, or the same quantity of a mixture comprised of equal parts of mild oyster shell lime, salt, and sifted ashes.

Feeding of Root.

Roots when fed with cows and other cattle, should be cut fine, and mixed with cut hay or straw. For milk cows and other cattle, a peck of roots and a peck of cut straw or hay, mixed together, sprinkled with salt, makes an enriching meal for each.

Working Animals.

See to it that these noble creatures do not suffer for anything that is necessary to their condition and comfort. As the weather increases in intensity of cold, they stand in the more need of warm though well ventilated stables.

Vinegar.

The juice of one bushel of sugar beets will make from five to six gallons of vinegar equal to the best wine. Wash and grate the beets, express the juice, put the liquor into a barrel, cover the bung with gauze, and set in the sun, in fifteen or twenty days it will be fit for use.

Animals in winter.

Farmers do not sufficiently sub-divide their yards in winter. Large and small animals are turned in promiscuously together, and every farmer knows the larger ones are very ferocious and domineering towards those much inferior, and careful not to provoke the wrath of such as are nearly equal.

Food Consumed by Cows.

Pro. S. W. Johnson says that, according to experiments made in Bavaria cows, to give the greatest quantity of milk, must consume daily one-third of their live weight in hay, or other food of equivalent value. More food increases flesh and fat, and less diminishes milk.


