Lawyers, under which term is included every person whose business it is, for fee or reward, to prosecute or defend any cause in any court of record, or other judicial tribunal of the United States, or any of the States, or give advice in relation to any cause or matter pending therein (lawyers refusing to pay for this license shall not be allowed to practice in any such court or tribunal), for each license ten dollars.

Leather, band per pound 1 1/2 cts. Butt per pound 1 1/2 cts. Damaged per pound 5 mills. Enamelled per square foot 5 mills. Enamelled skirting per square foot 1 1/2 cts. Harness per pound 7 mills. Harness made from hides imported east of the Cape of Good Hope per pound 5 mills.—Oil per pound 5 mills. Oil dressed per pound 2 cts. Patent per square foot five mills. Patent japanned splits used for dasher leather per square foot 4 mills. Patent or enamelled skirting per square foot 1 1/2 cts. Rough made from hides imported east of the Cape of Good Hope per pound 5 mills. Rough, all other, hemlock tanned per pound 7 mills.—Rough, tanned in whole or in part with oak per pound 1 cent. Sole, made from hides imported east of the Cape of Good Hope per pound 5 mills. Sole, all other, hemlock tanned per pound 7 mills. Sole, tanned whole or in part with oak per lb 1 cent. Legacies.—Any person or persons having charge or trust, as administrators, executors, or trustees, of any legacies or distributive shares arising from personal property, of any kind whatsoever, where the whole amount of such personal property, as aforesaid, shall exceed the sum of \$1000 in actual value, passing from any person who may die after the passage of this act, possessed of such property, either by will or by the intestate laws of any State or Territory, or by any part of such property, or interest therein, or gift made or intended to take effect in possession or enjoyment after death of the grantor or bargainer, to any body or bodies, public or corporate, in trust or otherwise are subject to the following taxes: Where the person or persons, or to any beneficial interest in such property, shall be the immediate issue or lineal ancestor of the person who died possessed of such property, for each and every \$100 of the clear value of such interest \$1.00. Where the person or persons entitled to any beneficial interest in such property shall be a brother or sister of the grantor or bargainer, or a brother or sister of the person who died possessed of such property, for each and every \$100 of the clear value of such interest \$1.00. Where the person or persons entitled to any beneficial interest in such property shall be a brother or sister of the grandfather or grandmother, or a descendant of the brother or sister of the grandfather or grandmother of the person who died possessed of such property, for each and every hundred dollars of the clear value of such interest, four dollars. Where the person or persons entitled to any such beneficial interest in such property shall be any other degree of collateral consanguinity than is stated above, or shall be stranger in blood to the person who died possessed, as aforesaid, or shall be a body public or corporate, for each and every hundred dollars of the clear value of such interest 5 dollars.
