CONGRESSIONAL CONFERENCE.—The Democratic Conference of the 16th Congressional District, composed of the counties of Adams, Bedford, Franklin, Fulton and Somerset, met at the Bedford Hotel, in Bedford, on Wednesday, the 28th ult., to place in nomination a candidate for Congress.

The conference was organized by the election of Hon. G. W. Brewer as President and J. R. Donohoo and E. F. Kerr, Esqs., as Secretaries.

The conference proceeded to ballot and up to the thirty-fourth ballot each candidate received the three votes from his county.

A committee consisting of Messrs. Findlay, Brewer, Hill, Krise and McDonald, was appointed to inform Judge Kimmell of his nomination.

The committee on resolutions consisting of Messrs. Orr, Robinson, Groff, Krise and Kerr, report as follows:

Resolved, That we cordially endorse the administration of Andrew Johnson in his efforts to maintain the Constitutional authority of the Government against the usurpations and innovations of a partisan mob, claiming to represent, but misrepresenting, the people of the United States in Congress.

Resolved, That in placing the Hon. F. M. Kimmell in nomination for congress, we have selected a candidate of marked ability, of known integrity, and one who, as a member of the 41st Congress, will be an honor to our district, and we earnestly urge his claims upon every voter who desires that the management of the government of the present congress shall cease.

Resolved, That the proceeding of this conference be published in the Democratic papers of this district.

On motion of Hon. Hiram Findlay the following resolutions were adopted: Resolved, That the Democratic National Convention, meets not only with the hearty approval of this conference, but should meet with the approval of every man who desires the prosperity and happiness of his country.
