PEACE. - "There are certain places where politics should not be allowed to enter," says Mrs. Grumby, "and the home or local department of a country newspaper is one them." You are right, old woman, but you'll forgive us "just this once." As locals are scarce, our thoughts naturally wander over the great political contest just closed. We are reminded of the criticisms and reprimands, the irritants and counter-irritants made use of by the parties respectively battling for the mastery; the vituperation and slang heaped upon opposing candidates, and the dire calamities that were sure to be brought upon our beloved country in the event of the triumph of either party!

How could the electors choose? Seymour and Blair were to bring War and Desolation; Grant and Colfax, Peace and Tranquillity. After five years of sanguinary strife, such as the world never before beheld, brought about, too, by a radical idea peculiar to our section of this country, the people of the whole land naturally yearned for peace. This the Radicals promised them in wholesale abundance. The effect was to be instantaneous. From the moment the electric wires flashed the intelligence of the success of their candidates throughout the length and breadth of this land, a new era was to be dated. Peace was to grow up of a night like a mushroom, or cover the land over like the dew of a morning, or its white winged messenger was to shower it copiously upon the people as the manna was showered upon the hungry Israelites. The negroes of Georgia and elsewhere in the South, are still arming and shooting down their neighbors because they are white. Murder, theft, robbery and arson are still abroad in the land. Peace has not come. The oil has not been poured upon the troubled waters. When will this people become wise? When will passion and prejudice give way to reason and justice? Let us all pray - that we may have Peace.
