WAR AGAINST THE CREDIT SYSTEM.—The merchants and dealers of Somerset county have published a card in which they announce their intention of eventually abolishing the credit system entirely, and give notice that hereafter they will strictly adhere to the following rules: "No goods sold on longer credit than six months. That interest at the rate of 10 per cent. will be added to all accounts running over due. All running accounts will be considered due and payable July 1st and January 1st of each year. That we will not sell on credit theories of flour, grain, butter, eggs and bacon. If merchants and dealers would strictly adhere to the rules the above it would be far better for the buyer and seller. Experience teaches every one that long credits are ruinous and a curse alike to producer and consumer. "Pay as you go," is the true philosophy of the age.
