STATE DEPARTMENT. The whole machinery employed to conduct the business arising out of our foreign relations with all the powers of the world is far more simple than is generally conceived. The Assistant Secretary in the Department of State (Hon. Lewis Cass) is the Assistant Secretary of State, (Hon. Lewis Cass) one chief clerk, twelve clerks, one translator, and one interpreter.

Treasurer's Office.—Samuel Casey, esq., Treasurer, and thirteen clerks. He receives and keeps the moneys of the United States in his own hands, and is the possessor of the public seal of the office.
