

to him stating the amount required, and the particular purposes for which it is to be used.

Sec. 11. And be it enacted, That the trustee of the said Board of Trustees shall be for life or during good behavior, that a quorum shall consist of four members of said Board, and in case of vacancy occurring in said Board by death, resignation, or otherwise, the surviving Trustees shall have power to fill said vacancy by appointing thereon a person of Saint Mary's County.

Sec. 12. And be it enacted, That any person who shall wilfully destroy, mutilate, or remove any tomb, monument or grave stone, or any structure placed in said burial ground, or any structure, raising or other work for the protection or ornament of said ground, or shall wilfully destroy, cut, break, or remove any tree, plant, or shrub within its limits, on the proof thereof shall be deemed guilty of misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof before any Justice of the Peace shall be punished by fine, in the discretion of the Justice, according to the aggravation of the offense, not less than five nor more than fifty dollars, to be collected as small debts are collectible, and to be paid over to the said Board of Trustees, for the repair of the cemetery around said burial ground, or any other purpose connected with the same.

Sec. 13. And be it enacted, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
