Editors, Sept. 26th, 1883. Messrs. Editors:—Will you allow me the use of your columns to correct what I am sure was a mistake and calculated to do injury to an undertaking that should be fostered by all good citizens, regardless of party and especially by republicans. I will be as brief and pointed as possible. I refer to an article written by republicans and published in your paper some time back, and extracts from the Enterprise of your own, which spoke of the vindicator, its aims, etc.

being anti-republican and calculated to injure the party by inducing the colored race to game under republican colors. As I then knew nothing of the Vindicator, its objective points, platform, etc., I could say nothing except to heartily endorse the writers if their charges were true. Well, a few days ago through the kindness of Col. Murrell, I received a booklet containing the platform of doctrines upon which they stand. Now I find that the writers referred to were entirely mistaken, and therefore determined to give the public the true basis upon which the Vindicator conducted their paper stands. Now I understand the doctrine of republicanism. The Vindicator teaches true, genuine, orthodox republicanism. Besides the justice of their claims, the general good to be derived to all classes from the carrying them out, is plain and patent. I do not see how any good citizen, be he republican or democrat can demur to them. They start first with a view of elevating their race to the scale of humanity. How? By inducing the colored race to occupy the place of white race? Certainly not. But by demanding to be something more than voting machines in the hands of others. They claim that heretofore, they have been merely so many votes to be counted for or against a candidate and that whilst (and no one will deny the fact) they have been as true to the republican party as man could be, yet up to this time, there has been no effort made to open the avenues for them to share the honors and emoluments they help to win and therefore, whilst still believing in the republican principles, they must demand to be recognized as a power in the party, as something more than aught mules for those who in many instances are intellectually and morally their inferiors only having a white skin to recommend them. They claim to be the true and honest friends of the colored race, and that they shall be allowed in public life to occupy the place that brain and morality will put them; that they are tax-payers, soldiers and sailors and that they are entitled to the same rights of citizenship and honor and distinction that others of the same class have; that they are no longer satisfied with the shadow of political freedom but claim the substance as well. They claim the amendment and enlargement of the loyal act, so that it embrace the colored as well as the white females of the state, that the same strong arm of the law be thrown around the virtue of the dark skin that there is around the white and that they be no longer classed with the least that must do their duty and be the prey of the most powerful; that negro women shall be cared for by the laws they help to maintain as well as the white; that the same care be shown to foster and encourage schools for the negro that there is for the white and that their schools be controlled and taught by their own race as do the whites. Now, is there anything wrong in these demands or is there anything that clashes with the true interests of the republican party; is there anything contrary to the teachings of that grand old party, those whose principles have lately become the resting place of so many repentant democrats? Is not the elevation and advancement of all citizens regardless of color or previous condition, etc., the very spirit of our party? Where is the wrong to republicanism? While still maintaining their love for her teachings, they simply ask to share in her blessings. They may lessen the chance of a few men for office, but true, sterling worth will always find an outlet. In other words, whilst the nodes of the tree may be crowded with would-be climbers, there will always be room on top for a few more. In all the articles and many very able ones I have read in the Vindicator, I have yet to see the first one in which the principles of our party, and it does seem to me, that every single one of that race who is capable of intelligent thought and who is in support of those just claims, as well as every intelligent white man whose mind is not distorted by color blindness. As for myself, believing that as they are laboring and must remain so, our true interest is to give them all laudable ambition possible. I therefore freely and cheerfully tender my poor aid to help them in the fulfillment of this just and noble cause. I believe in an affording my duty as a republican, a patriot and a gentleman, and if I am wrong, will some one please show me my error.
