Governor Jackson Calls an Immigration Convention.

Governor Jackson on Tuesday, of last week, issued the following call for a State Immigration Convention to be held in Baltimore on February 18th, instant:

"Much interest in immigration has developed during the last few years in most of the Southern States, and in some of them great good has resulted from proper effort. This whole subject was considered by the Southern Interstate Immigration Convention, lately held at Asheville, N. C.

"In accordance with this recommendation a State Convention is hereby called to consider the subject of immigration, and the interest of Maryland therein, the same to meet in Mozart Hall, in the City of Baltimore, on Wednesday, the 18th day of February, 1891, at 11 o'clock, A. M.

"All citizens of the State interested in the subject are invited to attend, and it is recommended that all land and improvement companies, and neighborhoods in which there is much surplus land for sale, should provide for proper representation in this meeting.

"The special need for Maryland seems to be for immigrants of the right class who will come in families, or colonies and, taking up small holdings by purchase or as tenants, occupy our unused land and carry on trucking, fruit-growing, dairying and the other lines of farming for which this State is particularly adapted.

"The Maryland delegates to the Interstate Convention will be reported to the Baltimore meeting, and an opportunity will be given for discussing the means for making widely known the advantages afforded by Maryland in soil and climate."
