NEWS IN BRIEF.

From the Baltimore Sun.

Wednesday, April 5, 1893.

The oyster police steamers Thomas and McLane will attend the Hampton Roads naval review.

The President will live this summer in the Middleton House, on the Woodley lane near Washington.

The President has commuted to imprisonment for life the sentence of Edward Smallwood, a colored boy, convicted in Washington of the murder of Edgar Tinney.

Carter H. Harrison, democrat, was elected mayor of Chicago over Samuel W. Allerton, republican, by about nineteen thousand majority.

The republicans of Michigan elected their candidate to the Supreme Bench, Monday, by about 10,000 plurality. The republicans made gains in democratic counties.

In the United States Senate argument against the admission of the Senators appointed by Governors of Western States was made by Mr. Vest. The President nominated several ministers to European countries.

Thursday, April 6, 1893.

Twelve thousand barrels of whiskey were burned in a Louisville warehouse. Loss \$230,000.

Senator Roach was indorsed and his assailants condemned by a mass-meeting at Grafton, N. D.

It is predicted that Russia's cholera epidemic next summer will be even worse than last year.

Commander Seth has issued an order to the oyster navy to keep a sharp lookout upon boats buying oysters.

At a speech before a republican club in New York Mr. John S. Wise eulogized Gen. Lee, and there was loud cheering for the Confederate leader.

A delegation from Anne Arundel county saw Senator Gorman and informed him that all factional differences in the county were adjusted satisfactorily and that in the future there would be harmony in the democratic ranks.

In the United States Senate the question of the right of the appointed Senators from the West to their seats was further discussed. The nomination of Herman Stump, of Maryland, to be superintendent of immigration was confirmed.

Commissioner Blount has arrived at Honolulu where he was enthusiastically received. The people are working energetically for annexation. It is said that Minister Smith, at Washington, and Consul-General Pratt, at San Francisco, have been recalled by the provisional government.

Sixty democrats of Prince George county, Md., called on Senator Gorman and Representative Compton to urge the appointment of William B. Clegg as internal revenue collector at Baltimore. Mr. Gorman addressed the delegation, telling them that influences have been brought to bear on the appointing power that may effect the ability of the Maryland Congressional delegation to secure many offices for friends.
