The democrats elected their full ticket in New Castle, Delaware.

John O. Hudson, Democrat, has been elected mayor of Bordentown, N. J., for the fifteenth term.

The Eagle Woolen Mills, in Hubbardston, Mass., were totally destroyed by fire. Loss \$75,000 to \$100,000.

Bishop Spalding, of the Roman Catholic diocese of Peoria, is in favor of the opening of the World's Fair on Sunday.

Mrs. Frances M. Walker, believed to have been one hundred and eleven years old, died in Philadelphia.
