In pursuance of the plan of organization adopted by the Democratic County Convention, held on the 3rd day of September 1892, the Democratic voters of St. Mary's County, are requested to meet at the usual places of voting in their several election districts on SATURDAY, the 26th day of August, 1893, and to vote for such persons as they may desire to be candidates of the party at the ensuing election, for the following county ticket, composed of:

In case the parties desiring to be candidates as aforesaid do not comply with the foregoing, their names will not be on said tickets. The polls will open at 10 o'clock, a. m., and close at 6 o'clock, p. m.

NEWS IN BRIEF.

From the Baltimore Sun.

Friday August 12, 1893. Snow Hill is making plans for rebuilding the burnt district. Both houses of Congress met yesterday and without transacting any business adjourned. In New York two physicians assert that they have discovered that the virus of pryncleas is a cure for cancer. The Ohio Democratic State Convention met at Cincinnati yesterday and nominated a State ticket, headed by Lawrence T. Neal for Governor. The largest steamboat in the world was successfully launched at Chester (Pa.) river. The new boat will head the fleet of the Fall River Line. The republicans of Frederick will nominate candidates for county commissioner and contest the constitutionality of the act continuing the present board of office. The administration, it is said, feels the necessity of the House of Representatives passing such rules as will permit speedy action on the financial question. In Philadelphia the banks are compelled to buy currency at 2 or 3 per cent. premium. Much money is hoarded and there is difficulty in providing money for the Saturday pay-rolls. A colored man in Norfolk beat his wife into insensibility and then slashed her with a razor a score of times because she went on an excursion on which he had forbidden her to go. At Westminster the democrats nominated Charles B. Roberts for chief and James Revell for associate judge of the fifth circuit. The name of Judge I. Thomas Jones was withdrawn from the contest for chief judge.

Proclamation by the Governor.

STATE OF MARYLAND, EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT.

WHEREAS, Section one of Article fourteen of the Constitution of Maryland makes it the duty of the Governor, to order the publication in certain newspapers, of a bill designated by him of any bill, or bill, passed proposing any amendments to the said Constitution; and

WHEREAS, at the January Session, 1892, of the General Assembly of Maryland, a bill was passed proposing an amendment to the Constitution, which amendment is Chapter 313 of the Acts of 1892, and is as follows, to wit:

CHAPTER 313. AN ACT to add an additional section to Article four of the Constitution of this State.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, Three-fifths of all the members of the House concurring, that the following section, as an amendment to the Constitution of this State; and if adopted by the legal and qualified voters thereof, as herein provided, the same shall be and stand in the place of Section thirty nine of Article four of said Constitution.

SEC. 2. The General Assembly shall, as often as it may think the same proper and expedient, provide by law for the election of an additional Judge of the Supreme Bench of Baltimore city, and whenever provision is so made by the General Assembly, the same shall be and stand in the place of Section thirty nine of Article four of said Constitution.

SEC. 3. And be it further enacted, by the authority aforesaid, That the foregoing section hereby proposed as an amendment to the Constitution, shall be, at the next general election to be held in this State, submitted to the legal and qualified voters thereof for their adoption or rejection in pursuance of the direction contained in Article fourteen of the Constitution of this State; and at the said general election, the vote on said proposed amendment to the Constitution shall be by ballot, and upon each ballot there shall be written or printed the words "For" and "Against the Amendment," as the voter may elect, and immediately after said election the return shall be made to the Governor of the votes for and against the proposed amendment, as directed by said fourteenth Article of the Constitution.

Approved, April 4, 1892.

We hereby certify that the foregoing is a correct copy of an Act of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed January Session, 1892.

Now, therefore, I, Frank Brown, Governor of Maryland, do hereby order and direct that the said heretofore described bill, or Act of the General Assembly, proposing an amendment to the Constitution of Maryland, be published one week for at least three months in two newspapers published in each county of this State, if so many are therein published, and in three newspapers in the city of Baltimore, before the next ensuing general election, which day of November, 1893; at which election the proposed amendment aforesaid will be submitted to the legal and qualified voters of Maryland for adoption or rejection.

Given under my hand and the Great Seal of Maryland, at the city of Annapolis, on the 19th day of July, A. D. 1893, at which time I, Frank Brown, Governor of Maryland, being present, did sign the same, and did affix thereto the Great Seal of the said State, the one hundred and seventeenth.
