Before another issue of the Beacon the Maryland General Assembly for 1896 will have adjourned sine die.

Legislative.

The Governor has approved the Act amending the charter of St. Mary's Female Seminary.

The bill to appropriate \$5,000 to rebuilding the main building of Charlotte Hall Academy has passed the Senate.

Saturday was the last day on which bills could be introduced in either branch of the Maryland General Assembly.

Mr. Chesley has introduced a bill regulating the sale of tobacco in the State. The bill provides that no commission shall be paid on tobacco sold.

ASSESSMENT.

The majority of the Conference Committee have outlined an Assessment bill in a report made to the General Assembly, but it is yet doubtful whether the bill will become a law.

APPOINTMENTS OF ASSESSORS

As to the machinery of assessment: Under the House bill the Governor is required to appoint one in each of the counties and one for each election precinct in the city of Baltimore.

The committee has adopted and recommended a compromise measure as to the machinery of assessments, briefly stated as follows: In the counties the county commissioners are to appoint one election district assessor for each election district of the State.

In the counties the county commissioners are to act as boards of control and review. In the city of Baltimore there are no assessors at large. The Appeal Tax Court is to group the precinct assessors into groups of three and they act together in their precincts.

to either. The rate of compensation proposed is that of the House bill, \$4 per diem both in the counties and in Baltimore city.

The listing and scaling features of the House bill are retained, with the exception that the individual citizen, although required to make out a schedule of his property in advance of his meeting with the assessors, is to swear to it in the presence of the assessors, and the listing, instead of being an annual one, is to be a biennial one.

The report of the conference committee has been adopted in both the Senate and House and it now rests with Governor Lowndes to say whether it shall become a law.

Mr. Henry Spicer, a prominent farmer, of Hancock district, Washington county, is dead, aged eighty-seven years.

Mr. Clagett, an ex tax collector of Howard county, and Lee Williams, colored, were killed at Elliott City by an explosion of dynamite.
