C., has been making another warm speech on the Pension question, his text being the case of the Michigan man who draws \$1800 a year as a clerk in the Interior Department, and \$1200 a year as private Secretary to Representative S. W. Smith, of Michigan, and who has been voted by Congress a pension of \$73 a month for total disability.

Representative H. C. Smith, cited the case of Justice Long, of the Supreme Court of Michigan, who draws a pension of \$140 a month as an excuse for this case, and Mr. Talbert said in reply: Two wrongs do not make one right.
