Gibson Gantt) and Robert Stoddard (being the only child of said Laura Gantt now living by her former husband, John T. Stoddard,) are seized as tenants in common of the remainder in the said tract of land after the aforesaid death of said Laura Gantt, each being entitled to an undivided one-fifth interest therein; that the said real estate is not susceptible of advantageous partition, and cannot be divided without loss or injury between the parties thereto; that the said Robert Stoddard and Catharine H. Stoddard, his wife, are non-residents of the State of Maryland.
