Stoddert), are seized as tenants in common of the same real estate, and that after the aforesaid death of said Laura Gantt, each being entitled to an undivided one-fifth interest therein; that the said real estate is not susceptible of advantageous partition, and cannot be divided without loss or injury to the three parties thereto; that the said Robert Stoddert and Catharine H. Stoddert, his wife, are non-residents of the State of Maryland.


