Mrs. Longstreet was born in the American Union, after the Confederate struggle had become the 'Lost Cause' of American history. She evidently has never known what it was to hate anything American.

'If it be thought strange that I should write a preface to the memoir of a conspicuous adversary, I reply that the civil war is only a memory, its asperities are forgotten, both armies were American, old army friendships have been renewed, and new army friendships have been formed among the combatants, the truth of history is dear to all of us and the amenities of chivalrous manhood are cherished alike by the North and South, when justice to either is involved.'

Sickles is one of the most famous of the surviving Union officers of the civil war. He has been prominent in Democratic politics in New York since the war, and has suffered much in consequence.

The south will not fall out with Mrs. Longstreet for defending the great name she bears, now that the stout warrior is dead and cannot answer his accusers; a magnanimous people will honor her for it.—Exchange.
