Walked 40 Miles in Storm.
Leo Spares, Colored Sailor, Tells of Remarkable Endurance feat.

Leo Spares, a colored sailor, well known among the bay skippers, if honest in the story he told yesterday at a downtown shipchandlery, would make a good subject for Arctic expeditions. Spares, who hails from Leonardtown, engaged with Capt. Eggers, of the schooner Grace Bennett, to accompany him to Washington on Tuesday and become one of the crew of the Bennett lying at that port.

It was known that Spares had made his agreement, and according to his own story he started with Capt. Eggers, but they were separated by the "Jim-Crow" law, which placed Spares in an apartment assigned to his color. Reaching Washington, the sailor says, he got out of the train and could not find Capt. Eggers nor locate his luggage. With but one cent in his pocket he started back to Baltimore over the tracks traversed by the train that took him away. He claims to have walked during the night, stopping when he got tired, and succeeded in reaching the Back Basin in Baltimore at noon yesterday.

Spares could not be shaken in his story, but not one of those present could be prevailed upon to credit the statement of a man walking 40 miles through the merciless wind and snow that prevailed Tuesday night. There was no doubt of Spares being in a chilled condition, as he hugged a stove for several hours to thaw out.

The master of the schooner J. Dallas Marvill, who knew Spares, said it was possible he made the trip, as on one occasion Spares was one of the crew of a schooner that sailed from Petersburg for Baltimore and left him behind. Nothing daunted, he started to walk to Baltimore. The vessel having met with head winds and storms Spares was here awaiting her when she arrived.
