News Notes.

Dr. Elton W. Townsend, a young graduate of medicine, died of cerebro-spinal meningitis at his home in Somerset county.

Snow, ice and very low temperature were reported from various parts of Maryland on Sunday, causing apprehension for early fruits.

The State of South Carolina has established a bureau in New York to divert the surplus labor from that city and thus solve the negro problem.

A large pigeon house belonging to Mr. M. W. Pope, at Mount Washington, was burned, with from 1,000 to 1,500 pigeons and a pair of dogs.

The dwelling of Mortimer Brandenburg, near Hyattsville, Montgomery county, was destroyed by fire. Loss, \$3,000; insurance, \$1,000.

WASHINGTON LETTER.

Washington, D. C., April 17, 1906.

While the President of the United States is receiving the plaudits of the people of Texas and of the Southwest generally, a tribute to the position he occupies and to the man of warm, red blood, the kind of man who is admired down in that section of our country, he is having a few bricks thrown at him in the capital of the nation by some of the thinking men of Congress who have remained in the city.

No man is saying anything unkind of the personality of the President, but of his acts as President in recent past. I spoke in my letter of last week of the Panama Canal business and of the action of the President in the Santo Domingo matter as things that are being criticized by the men who make the laws of the country.
