Mrs. Jane Cornelia Payne.
At Laurel Grove, St. Mary's County, Maryland, on July 10, 1907, Mrs. Jane Cornelia Payne, widow of the late John Lewis Payne, passed away to her eternal rest, aged 72 years. Although, for a number of years Mrs. Payne had been in failing health, still her death coming so suddenly and unexpectedly, was a great shock to her family and friends. Her remains were buried in the family lot, in St. Joseph's Cemetery. She sweetly sleeps in Jesus, for "They who hath Gods spirit here, Shall see Him there."
