Nation of Small Land-Owners.

The large estates and great farms and ranches all over the United States are from year to year being divided up into small farms, which are cultivated by owners or tenants living upon them. The tendency of this condition here is greater than in any other country in the world. In a recent address upon small land owners at a St. Louis Exposition gathering, it was well said that if we educate the people to use the land themselves and enjoy it, they will get the land, because the man who lives on his own land will make a profit from it by his own labor and not be the purveyor of the product of the labor of others. The very fact that there are large numbers of men ready to take the land and till it by their own labor, and get their living from it, and know how to do it, will make it practically impossible to compete with them in the production of crops raised with hired labor. That fact alone will necessarily regulate the price of land, so that we need never fear a land monopoly in this country under such conditions. The big farmer who hires his labor can not stand the competition of the small farmer who lives on his own land and farms it with his own labor.—Indiana Farmer.
