Rufus Wheeler Peckham, of New York, Associate Justice of the Supreme Court of the United States, died at his summer home near Allardt, last Sunday in the 71st year of his age. He was appointed to the Supreme Bench in 1895 by President Cleveland. His death was due to angina pectoris. Judge Harlan, the oldest Justice in point of service on the Supreme Bench, says: "Justice Peckham's death is a great loss to the country. He was one of the ablest jurists that ever sat on the American Bench. He was one of the purest men I ever knew."

Mrs. Robert H. Gass, who was Miss Edith M. Bailey, daughter of Judge James H. Bailey, of the 7th district, died rather suddenly at home on St. Patrick's Creek, Monday night, October 26. Her unexpected death was a great shock to the large circle of relatives and friends; but she had been well prepared for the end by all the rites and sacraments of the Sacred Heart. And for the purpose of voting for the approval or rejection of PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF MARYLAND proposed amendment being as follows:

CHAPTER 24.
AN ACT to amend Section one of Article one, title, "Elective Franchise", of the Constitution of this State, and to provide for the submission of said Amendment to the qualified voters of this State for adoption or rejection.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, three-fifths of all the members of each of the two Houses concurring, that the following section be, and the same is hereby proposed as an amendment to Section one of Article one, title, "Elective Franchise", of the Constitution of this State, and it is adopted by the qualified voters thereof, as hereinafter provided, it shall supersede and stand in the place and stead of Section one of said Article one.

Sec. 1. All elections shall be by ballot, and every male citizen of the United States of the age of twenty-one years or upwards, who has been a resident of the State for two years and of the Legislative District of Baltimore City or of the county in which he may offer to vote, for one year next preceding the election, and who, moreover, is duly registered as a qualified voter as provided in this Article, shall be entitled to vote, in the ward or election district in which he resides, at all elections hereinafter to be held in this State, and in case any county or city shall be so divided as to form sections at different election districts for the election of Representatives in Congress, Senators, Delegates or other officers, then to entitle a person to vote for such officer, he must have been a resident of that part of the county or city which shall form a part of the electoral district in which he offers to vote, for one year next preceding the election; but a person who shall have resided in such county or city, entitling him to vote at any such election, shall be entitled to vote in

the election district from which he removed, until he shall have accepted a residence in the part of the county or city to which he has removed.

Every male citizen of the United States having the above prescribed qualifications of age and residence, entitled to be registered as to become a qualified voter if he be, first: a person who, on the first day of January in the year eighteen hundred and sixty-nine and the date of the adoption of this section of this Article; or second: a male descendant of such last mentioned person; or third: a person who, in the presence of the officers of registration, shall, in his own handwriting, with pen and ink, without any aid, suggestion or assistance from any other person, and without any question or direction addressed to him by any of the officers of registration, make application to register correctly, stating in such application his name, age, date and place of birth, residence and occupation at the time and for the two years next preceding, the name or names of his employer or employers, if any, and for the two years next preceding, and whether he be a person previously voted, and if so, the State, county or city and district or precinct in which he voted last, and also the name in full of the street and the number of the residence of the Justices of the Supreme Court of the United States, of the Governor of Maryland, of one of the Judges of the Court of Appeals of Maryland, and of the Mayor of Baltimore City, if the applicant resides in Baltimore City, or of one of the County Commissioners of the county in which the applicant resides; and any person who is unable to comply with the foregoing requirements as to making application for registration in his own handwriting, solely because he is physically disabled from so doing; or sixth: a person, or the husband of a person, who at the time of his application for registration, is a bona fide owner of real or personal property in an amount not less than \$50 hundred dollars, as assessed thereon on the tax-books of the City of Baltimore or of one of the counties of the State, and who is the owner and no assessor for two years next preceding his application for registration; shall have paid and shall produce receipts for the taxes on said property for said year and shall file with the officers of registration that he is, or that he is the husband of the person who is the bona fide owner of the property so assessed to him or her, and that he has been a resident of the election district in which he offers to vote, as aforesaid, for one year next preceding his application.

No person not qualified under some one of the above classes shall be entitled to be registered as a qualified voter, or be entitled to vote. Every written application to be registered, presented to the officers of registration by any person applying to be registered under any one of the above classes, shall be carefully preserved by said officers of registration and shall be produced in any Court, if required, as hereinafter provided.

The affidavit of any applicant for registration, duly made to the officers of registration or in Court, that he, the applicant, is a person who is entitled to vote on or before the first day of January in the year eighteen hundred and sixty-nine and the date of the adoption of this section of this Article, as aforesaid, or his husband or wife, or his father and mother, shall be a descendant of a person who was entitled to vote on or before the first day of January in the year eighteen hundred and sixty-nine and the date of the adoption of this section of this Article, shall be prima facie evidence of any of the facts so sworn to.

A wilfully false statement upon the part of any applicant for registration in relation to any of the matters aforesaid shall be perjury, and punishable as perjury is punished by the laws of this State.

Any person who feels aggrieved by the action of any of the officers of registration in refusing to register as a qualified voter, or in registering any disqualified person, may at any time, either before or after the last session of the board of officers of registration in Baltimore City, in any court of common law jurisdiction in said city, setting forth the grounds of his application and asking for the action of the board of officers of registration corrected. The court shall forthwith set the petition for hearing and direct summons to be issued requiring the board of officers of registration to appear and answer to the petition, and upon said written application the court shall determine whether or not said person, whose name is on the books of registration, complied with the requirements of said fifth clause; and if the court shall determine that said written application, so prepared and submitted by said person, complied with the requirements of said fifth clause, and that said person was not disqualified under any other provision of this Article of the Constitution to be registered upon the books of registry in question, then the court shall order said person to be registered as a qualified voter; but if the court shall determine that said written application of said person failed to comply with the requirements of said fifth clause, or that said person was in any other respect disqualified to be registered upon the books of registry in question, then the court shall order that said person shall not be registered upon said books of registry.

The court may enforce any order by attachment for contempt in said cases; neither party shall have any right of appeal from the decision of the court in any of the cases and an appeal shall be allowed to the Court of Appeals as in other cases; all such appeals shall be taken within five days from the date of the decision complained of, and shall be heard and decided by the Court of Appeals upon the original papers, or otherwise, as the Court of Appeals may by rules prescribe, as soon as may be practicable.

The General Assembly shall have power to provide more fully by legislation not inconsistent with this section of this Article, for the hearing and determination of all such cases.
