Short Crop of Cow Peas



Prices are going up. The enormous demand for Cow Peas last year carried the price very high, and as the crop is very short and the acreage is rapidly extending, there are many indications which point to much higher prices as the sowing season approaches.

WHIP-POOR-WILL COW PEAS.
 The Whip-poor-wills are generally preferred in the Central and Southern States. They are bush form, early maturing and especially desirable for Peas.

NEW ERA COW PEAS.
 New Era's are a little earlier, and make more vine than the Whip-poor-wills.

WONDERFULS, CLAYS AND MIXED COW PEAS.

GOVERNOR'S PROCLAMATION APPOINTING THE REPRESENTATION OF THE SEVERAL COUNTIES AND BALTIMORE CITY IN THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, UNDER THE FEDERAL CENSUS OF 1910.

Whereas, Section Five of Article Three of the Constitution of the State of Maryland requires the Governor, immediately after the taking and publishing of the next National Census, or after any State enumeration of population, to arrange the representation in the House of Delegates in accordance with the apportionment provided for in Section Four of said Article Three of the Constitution, and to declare, by proclamation, the number of Delegates to which each county of the State and the city of Baltimore may be entitled under such apportionment, made upon the basis of such new census; and

Whereas, the said Section Four of Article Three of the Constitution provides that each of the several counties of the State having a population of eighteen thousand souls or less, shall be entitled to two Delegates; that every county having a population of over eighteen thousand and less than twenty-eight thousand souls, shall be entitled to three Delegates; that every county having a population of twenty-eight thousand and less than forty thousand souls, shall be entitled to four Delegates; that every county having a population of forty thousand and less than fifty-five thousand souls, shall be entitled to five Delegates; that every county having a population of fifty-five thousand souls and upwards, shall be entitled to six Delegates and no more, and that each of the Legislative Districts of Baltimore City shall be entitled to the number of Delegates to which the largest county shall or may be entitled under the foregoing apportionment; and

Whereas, it appears from the official certificate of the Director of the Federal Census of Nineteen Hundred and Ten, now on file in this Department and of the City of Baltimore, as ascertained and enumerated under said Federal Census of Nineteen Hundred and Ten, as follows, to-wit:

Now, THEREFORE, I, **AUSTIN L. CROTHERS**, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MARYLAND, under the authority and direction of said Section Five of Article Three of the Constitution of Maryland.

Do BY THIS MY PROCLAMATION, declare that the several counties of the State and the city of Baltimore are respectively entitled to representation in the House of Delegates, under the Federal Census of Nineteen Hundred and Ten, as follows, to-wit:

The Poultry Yard
 Good, clean runs are a delight to the bees.
 Sometimes litter gets so filthy that it is worse than none.
 Turkey eggs set this month should give good salable carcasses for Christmas feasts.
 Leave it to the hen to pick out the best nest to lay in. She can do it better than you can.
 Two sprinklings a week with kerosene oil should keep the house free from insect pests. But be thorough. Get the screens over the windows now, not disturb your favorites while they are asleep at night.
 Are you troubled with cross about your chicken yards? Cover the pens with wirenetting. That will fool the thieves.
 Overfeeding must be avoided, as must also underfeeding. Either extreme will stunt the growth of the young stock.
 Can't expect to succeed with broody hens, incubators and little chicks, these days, unless we stay close at home to meet all emergencies.
 Feed very little soft feed and you will raise more chicks. If you must feed soft stuff don't throw it upon the ground. Feed it in a small trough or on a clean board.
 In heavy-soil localities, gapes are apt to attack young chicks, especially when quartered on damp, heavy ground. In light, sandy soils this disease is practically unknown.
 Look suspiciously at eggs that have been laid in a stable stall. They may be alright, but test them carefully, lest you lead a man who buys them to say things that will make your ears burn.
