Short Crop of Cow Peas



Prices are going up. The enormous demand for Cow Peas last year carried the price very high, and as the crop is very short and the acreage is rapidly extending, there are many indications which point to much higher prices as the sowing season approaches.

WHIP-POOR-WILL COW PEAS.
 The Whip-poor-wills are generally preferred in the Central and Southern States. They are bush form, early maturing and especially desirable for Peas.

NEW ERA COW PEAS.
 New Era's are a little earlier, and make more vine than the Whip-poor-wills.

WONDERFULS, CLAYS AND MIXED COW PEAS.
 For Hay, the Wonderfuls or Mixed Cow Peas are more productive, they should always be planted with an occasional grain of Corn, Sorghum Seed, Kaffir Corn, etc., which will prevent the vines from getting damaged by coming in contact with the ground.

"Drunkard's Island" is the name by which the Salvation Army's latest colony for inebriates, off the coast of New Zealand, is known to passing mariners. Its real name is Pakatona.

The Salvation Army has recently completed plans for isolating confirmed drunkards on a couple of islands, one for men and one for women.

Only one island is available at present, but the success of this settlement has been such that the New Zealand Government and the Salvation Army may acquire another for women.

The only communication with the mainland is by the Salvation Army motor-boat, and the residents have no opportunity of reaching a public house.

All spirits and alcohol in any form are forbidden on Pakatona, and the colonists lead the simple life on a fruit diet, without drugs or policemen.

The New Zealand Government recently passed an act giving magistrates power to commit persons who have been four times convicted of drunkenness to Pakatona.

The residents work at market gardening, fruit culture, framemaking and the manufacture of children's toys.

Baking for an Army.
 No feature of the United States manoeuvre camp at San Antonio has attracted more attention than the division bakery. The bakery can turn out 20,000 two-pound loaves daily, and is at present delivering about bread.
