In less than three weeks the Primary will be held, and from now on the candidates will be campaigning seeking to enlist the voters in their support.

The Republican State nominees may be said to be already chosen for the candidates selected by the managers and slated for the position will have no opposition.

On the Democratic side, Senators Arthur P. Gorman, and Blair Lee are in the fight, Governor Crothers having withdrawn from the contest and announced that he would support Senator Lee.

With the exception of Congressman Talbot, of Baltimore county, who is managing the Lee campaign, the organization leaders seem united in support of Senator Gorman's candidacy. Whether they will be followed by the rank and file, remains to be seen.

Fortunately, the primary thus far has not developed any muddling and few, if any personalities have been indulged in. It is hoped that this feature will not be injected into the campaign and that it will be fought out on the proper lines and no bitter antagonisms be caused.

The Republican State Ticket will be: For Governor: Phillips Lee Goldsborough, of Dorchester county; for Attorney General, Morris A. Soper, of Baltimore City; for Comptroller, John H. Cunningham, of Carroll county.

Who May Vote in The Primaries
Only registered voters can participate, except in cases where the voter has attained his majority since the last registration. The law is as follows:

"The books of registry shall be furnished to the judges at each polling place by the respective Boards of Supervisors of Plection, and shall be used at such elections in the same way as they are now used at municipal, county or general elections held under the provisions of said Article 33."

Until after the next general registration in the counties, every person offering to vote at a primary election shall be required to state to which party he belongs and which party's candidate he intends to vote for at the every qualified person offering to vote in the several counties in the State at a primary election shall be permitted to vote in the primary election of that party to which he belongs and which party candidates he intends to vote for at the State or county election."

"Persons arriving at the age of twenty-one years after the closing of the next preceding registration, and entitled to be registered as qualified voters, shall be entitled to vote at the primary election, upon proving under oath, to the satisfaction of a majority of the judges of election, their right to registration in the precinct at which they shall claim the right to vote."
