

PROCLAMATION

Publication of Proposed Constitutional Amendments.

Whereas, at the January Session of the General Assembly of Maryland, held at the year of our Lord, nineteen hundred and ten, there was introduced and passed an Amendment to Article 1 of the Constitution, by adding thereto a Section to be known as Section 1, one proposing an Amendment to Section 2 of Article 2 of said Constitution, and one proposing an Amendment to Section 4 of Article 3 of said Constitution, said Acts being respectively Chapters 20, 20A and 20B of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland of 1910, and which are in the words following, to-wit:

CHAPTER 20.
 An Act to propose an Amendment to Article 1 of the Constitution of this State by adding thereto a new Section, to be known as Section 1, to follow Section 1 and to provide for the submission of said Amendment to the qualified voters of this State for adoption or rejection.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland (three-fifths of all members of each of the two houses concurring), that the following section be and the same be and it shall be the duty of the Governor of this State to submit to the qualified voters of this State, at a special election to be held on the first Monday in the month of November, nineteen hundred and eleven, and at which said election the vote of said voters shall be taken on the question whether they will adopt or reject the words "For the Constitutional Amendment" as follows:

Section 2. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the said foregoing section, hereby proposed as an Amendment to the Constitution, shall be the duty of the Governor of this State to submit to the qualified voters of this State, at a special election to be held on the first Monday in the month of November, nineteen hundred and eleven, and at which said election the vote of said voters shall be taken on the question whether they will adopt or reject the words "For the Constitutional Amendment" as follows:
