PROCLAMATION

Proposed Amendments to the Constitution of Maryland.

Whereas, at the January Session of the General Assembly of Maryland held in the year nineteen hundred and fourteen, Acts were passed, to wit: Chapter 396, proposing an amendment to Article 15, of the Declaration of Rights of the Constitution of Maryland; Chapter 416, proposing a new Article to said Constitution to be known as Article 'XII-A'; Chapter 453, proposing an additional section to Article III of said Constitution and Chapter 473, proposing an additional Article to said Constitution to be known as Article 'XVI'; Chapter 483, proposing an additional section to Article III of said Constitution and Chapter 473, proposing an additional Article to said Constitution to be known as Article 'XVI';

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland (three-fifths of all the Members of each of the two Houses concurring), That the following Article be and the same is hereby proposed in the place and stead of Article XV of the Declaration of Rights of the Constitution of the State of Maryland, as at present existing, and if adopted by the legal and qualified voters thereof, as herein provided, it shall supersede and stand in place and stead of said Article.

Section 2. The General Assembly at its first session after the adoption of this amendment shall, by Public General Law, provide a grant of money for such county or counties as may hereafter form a charter under the provisions of this Article. Such grant shall be made in such amount as the General Assembly may determine.

Section 3. Every charter so formed shall be subject to the legislative body in which shall be contained a law-making power of said city or county. Such legislative body in the City of Baltimore shall be known as the City Council of the City of Baltimore, and in any county shall be known as the County Council of the county.

Section 4. From and after the date of adoption of a charter by the City of Baltimore, or any county of this State, as hereinbefore provided, the Mayor of Baltimore or the County Council of said county, shall be known as the Mayor of Baltimore or the County Council of the county, and shall be known as the Mayor of Baltimore or the County Council of the county, and shall be known as the Mayor of Baltimore or the County Council of the county.

Section 5. Amendments to any charter adopted by the City of Baltimore or by any county of this State under the provisions of this Article may be proposed by a resolution of the Mayor of Baltimore or the County Council of said city or county, and shall be so arranged as to permit the voter to vote for or against the charter proposed, and not less than 25 per cent. of the registered voters of said city or county, provided, however, that in any case 10,000 signatures shall be sufficient to complete a petition, and if the majority of the voters cast for and against the creation of said charter board shall be against said charter board, the charter board shall be void; but if such majority shall be in favor of the creation of said charter board, the charter board shall be created.
