William S. Copeage.

The death of Judge William S. Copeage, which occurred at the residence of his son, Mr. John B. Copeage, near Prayden, on Saturday last, removed from the county one of our most active men of affairs and useful citizens, and was the cause of genuine grief among his wide circle of friends. Judge Copeage was born near Church Hill in January, 1842, and early in 1862 came to St. Mary's to make his home, where he was married to Miss Charlotte Gayther, who died about eight years ago. The enviable record of Judge Copeage's term as Associate Judge of the Orphans' Court during an incumbency of sixteen years brought him in contact with a number of our people, whom he impressed as a broad-minded, capable and conscientious man and a courteous gentleman. He leaves a considerable estate, which is a monument to his thrift and energy. He is survived by four sons, John B., Dudley W., Dr. Wm. G. and Dr. H. Ross Copeage. His funeral was largely attended, interment being in Poplar Hill Cemetery. Peace to his ashes!


Miss Lilly Payne, of Bolton, Va., is visiting Mr. James T. Bailey, St. Margaret's Island.

Harrington Carries the State--Will Have a Majority in the Convention--Platform to be Along the Lines of Economy--Weller the Republican Candidate--Majority Over His Opponent--Largo--Baltimore City's Vote Split--Largo Vote Polled--Returns Late in coming in.

Indications and returns from the State show plainly that the nomination of Comptroller Harrington is certain. Lee carried St. Mary's by 245 majority. The vote in St. Mary's is as follows:
