ITEMS TO INTEREST ALL

WASHINGTON

Imports of gold during the ten days ended July 29 amounted to \$32,954,283. The administration's farm credits bill passed the senate without a roll call. The battleship is still the supreme weapon of sea warfare, according to the official observers who watched the recent aerial bombing tests of obsolete and former German naval craft off the Virginia Capes. NATION'S BUSINESS

Fresh rates on grain and products for export from the Central Freight Association territory to the Atlantic seaboard and other ports. Army and navy officers advocated an embargo on imports of dyes before the Senate Finance Committee. The war service of Brigadier General Amos Fries, chief of the chemical warfare service of the army, and Admiral W. S. Strout Smith.

GENERAL

Employers of the port of Havre, France, have declared a lockout against the dock employees. The British war office is negotiating for the sale of the 30,000 army horses in Mesopotamia which the colonial secretary said were to be destroyed owing to the high cost of bringing them home. The largest dirigible in the world, the ZR-2, bought by the United States from England at a cost of \$2,000,000, will start for this country on August 25, according to an announcement just made by the navy department. Commander L. H. Maxfield, U. S. N., will be in command.

FOREIGN

Walters in Berlin, after two tipless years, are asking either reinstatement of the old privileges or for double the present ten per cent levy on restaurant business. Nine racehorses were detained at the American Railway Express Company's yards in Buffalo by customs inspectors because of a large quantity of liquor found in the same car. A cable dispatch was published to the effect that Sir Thomas Lipton would challenge for an America's Cup race in 1922. The report was discredited by officers of the New York Yacht Club.

12 MILE LIMIT SET AS DRY BOUNDARY

Attorney General's Office Finds Statute to Cover Libel on British Schooner.

The dry boundaries of the United States were set twelve miles from the coast. The three mile limit which boose running and rum running were running since the Prohibition act, became a thing of the past. That the statute decision was reached by the United States attorney general's office in giving authorization to United States Attorney William Hayward of New York to bring libel proceedings against the British schooner Henry L. Marshall, seized by coast guard men off the Jersey shore.

The decision of the government to press the case against the Britisher came after some hours of doubt and only after Mr. Hayward had laid his case fully before Acting Attorney General Goff and they had gone over the evidence in a thorough discussion. Then it was announced that Mr. Hayward's investigation had shown that the schooner had violated both the Volstead and the custom laws. The alleged smuggling act violation, if upheld as grounds for checking the operations of rum running craft, will put an end to the hopes of those American citizens who were still hoping that real booze may yet be brought into the country. The three mile limit, which used to be a sort of joke, now appears to have been a bad joke.

LATEST EVENTS AT WASHINGTON

The doctors of the United States public health service are diagnosing the case of sick rivers with a view to prescribing proper remedies as that service has been advised by the U. S. navy. The sick river whose case is now receiving attention is the Illinois. Consideration of regulations prohibiting liquor on board American ships because of alarming deficits has been asked by Shipping Board officials in an appeal to the Internal Revenue Bureau.

GENERAL

General Fries and Admiral Smith described the importance of the dye industry in time of war and declared that the United States would have been in a much better position if such an industry had been developed before the war. Herman A. Metz of New York, who is both a manufacturer and an importer of German dyes, opposed an embargo on foreign dyes, although stating that he believed adequate protection should be provided through protective tariff duties.

FOREIGN

Mellon Gives Revised Estimate and Figures on Proposed Motor Car Tax and Others.

TOTAL NEED \$4,550,000,000 Federal Cost Must Be Cut \$250,000,000 to Avoid Added Burden—Puts Internal Tax Need at \$3,830,000,000.

Washington.—Insisting before the House Ways and Means Committee that there should be no addition of taxes, but a lightening of the burdens, Republican Floor Leader Mondell said: "It is entirely practical, in my opinion, to reduce the total tax levy by at least \$500,000,000 and still meet all proper, necessary, and essential expenses of the Government."

5,000 RUM FINES IMPOSED

Twelve at Atlantic City Admit Dry Violation.

Atlantic City.—Fines aggregating \$5,000 were imposed in court here upon 12 defendants, who either were convicted or had pleaded guilty of violation of the new state prohibition enforcement act. William Maynard, proprietor of the Fremont hotel at Atlantic City, was found guilty on eight counts. The heaviest fine, \$1,750, was imposed on him. Unable to furnish the cash, Maynard was committed to jail.

Washington.—Czecho-Slovakia has minted its first metal currency, Consul C. S. Winans, at Prague, informs the Commerce Department. The new coins were struck in the mint at Kremnice and are of 20 heller denomination 20mm. in diameter, bearing the inscription "Czecho-Slovakia Republic."
