The Tariff, Moody and Cabbages.

Raising cabbages is a big industry in Henderson county and many people depend on it for their prosperity. This year the price is so low that the farmers are having to plow up their cabbages. Cotton farmers, cotton manufacturers and cabbage growers were overlooked in the Dingley prosperity that Pritchard tells us so much about. The Hendersonville Hustler, giving an account of the joint debate between Gudge and Moody; shows that Moody is as deep as a nine hole about cabbage prosperity as Pritchard is about cotton mill prosperity. We quote: "The sensation of the day at Avery's Creek Tuesday came when Mr. Moody was in the midst of his prosperity argument. He was telling of the high prices of wheat, wheat, etc. Some democrat in the audience spoke up and said: "Tell them, Moody, about cabbages." Moody thinking it was some republican, caught at the idea and said: "Yes, see what the tariff has done for cabbages. Under the Wilson-Gorman bill they were on the free list; we put three cents tariff on them and now the farmer is getting a big price. I tell you, fellow-citizens, the tariff is what makes your stuff sell."

Hunt Will Sail the Air.

E. J. Hunt, an inventor of 152 East Fortieth Street, N. Y. City, declares that he has at last completed a flying machine, or a model of one, that, without the use of the balloons or nets, will be able to stay six weeks in the air without touching the ground the whole time.

Mr. Hunt declares that his invention has M. Santos-Dumont's flying machine beaten a mile, as it is neither of the aeroplane or gas bag pattern, but will derive its power from its air, and thus be able to stay aloft indefinitely, moving about with the greatest ease at the beck and call of the steersman. Once aloft, he says, it will revolutionize all ideas of navigating the air.

In his house under careful guard, Mr. Hunt has a model of his air ship twenty inches long. This, he says, has a flow about the room carrying a five pound weight.

The airship itself, he says, is to be built of aluminum, and is to weigh 68 pounds. In shape the model is very much like a boat or a body of a bird, and from the sides project a pair of light wings.

"I have solved the problem of aerial navigation," declared the inventor, when seen at his workshop yesterday. The airship will fly like a bird. I have already demonstrated its practicability. I don't need any balloons to keep this flying machine aloft. It keeps itself aloft. I use no motors either. The secret of its construction I keep to myself. No, the flying machine is not patented. I have not trusted the secret to a patent as yet.
