### The Town Of Grandin.

The Grandin Lumber Company has placed an order for the machinery, boilers, engines, etc, which will be used in the mammoth band mill plant to be located at Kings' Creek on what is known as the Greer farm. The machinery and equipment will be delivered in December and the plant to be put into operation next spring or summer.

The town which will be built up around the mill will be called Grandin in honor of the president of the Company, Mr. W. J. Grandin, and will be equipped with a modern electric light plant, an excellent water and sewerage system, and all modern conveniences. The work of grading is now in progress and building material for use in the construction of the houses is being placed.
