WESTON TO WALK ACROSS THE CONTINENT

Great Pedestrian Starts Next Monday on 4,300-Mile Trip—His Birthday.

His face as ruddy, his carriage as erect and his step as firm as a young athlete, Edward Weston, the veteran pedestrian announced Sunday that next Monday would start from New York on a walk to San Francisco.

Mr. Weston will be seventy-one years old on that day. As he put it when asked his age: "They tell me I will be seventy-one years old next Monday, but I don't feel it."

Mr. Weston will celebrate his three-score and eleventh birthday by starting on a jaunt of some 4,300 miles, which he hopes to finish in one hundred days.

Not Going Shortest Way. Mr. Weston is not taking the shortest route to the Pacific coast, which would be somewhat less than 3,400 miles to San Francisco.
