

CONNECTICUT GENERAL ASSEMBLY

Senate Votes for Final Adjournment on August 3—Egg Bill Passed—House Session Today

Hartford, July 15.—The senate was called to order at 11:15 by President pro tem. Brooks. Prayer by Chaplain Sexton.

Reports of Committees.
Cities and Boroughs—Unfavorable on bill concerning sealers of weights and measures for cities and boroughs. Bill rejected.

Night Rates Bill Rejected.
Senator Lattimer moved that the report of the judiciary committee on the bill relating to night telephone rates be accepted and the bill rejected. The bill was rejected by vote of 16 to 14.

Final Adjournment.
Senator Sears offered a resolution fixing August 3 as the day of final adjournment of the general assembly. The resolution was passed under suspension of rules and transmitted to the house.

Concerning Sale of Eggs.
Senator Stiles, the chairman of the committee on agriculture, advocated the passage of the bill concerning the sale of eggs. The bill was passed as amended by the house, and is as follows:

"Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly Convened: "Section 1. Every person, firm or corporation who shall sell or offer for sale eggs which have been kept in cold storage where chemicals are used, in pipes or otherwise, to create a low temperature, or have been preserved by an artificial process, shall affix to the package or receptacle containing such eggs, or shall conspicuously display with such eggs, a label or placard bearing in plain letters not less than one inch in height the words, 'cold storage eggs' or 'preserved eggs,' as the case may be.

"Sec. 2. Failure to comply with the provisions of this act, or the placing of such label or placard with eggs in such a manner as to misrepresent the quality or condition of such eggs, shall be punishable by a fine of not more than twenty-five dollars.

"Sec. 3. Nothing in this act shall 2566 of the general statutes, as amended, which are necessary for the enforcement of this act, are made part hereof."

Sale of Electricity.
Senator Mahwahing offered a resolution requesting the committee on the judiciary to make a report by July 20 on the bills relating to the sale of electricity. He said he had been spoken to by a number of people in his district about the matter.

The resolution was indefinitely postponed on the motion of Senator Sears.

Reports of Committees.
Agricultural—Unfavorable on bill concerning annual appropriations to incorporated agricultural societies; bill rejected.

Judiciary—Favorable on bills concerning appeals by minors, absentees or non-residents, by providing that appeals shall be tried by a jury, but other complaints shall be tried in chambers by the court, and that in cases of commitment to the county homes that appeals may be taken by persons who adequately represent the children committed. Calendar.

Concerning Sale of Liquors.
The following bill was explained by Senator Bradford and passed:

"Section 1. No person, firm, or corporation licensed to sell spirituous and intoxicating liquors at retail only shall sell or deliver any spirituous and intoxicating liquors outside the limits of the town in which such person, firm, or corporation is licensed to sell spirituous and intoxicating liquors.

"Sec. 2. Any person convicted of a violation of any provision of this act shall be subject to the penalties provided in Section 2712 of the general statutes, and any officer of any corporation selling or delivering spirituous and intoxicating liquors in violation of the provisions of this act shall be subject to said penalties.

"Sec. 3. Nothing in this act shall be construed to repeal section 2563 of the general statutes, or section 2711 of the general statutes, as amended by chapter 117 of the public acts of 1907."

GYPSE MOTH DESTROYERS.

None of the Imported Parasites to Be Brought to Connecticut.

It was said at the Connecticut agricultural experiment station in New Haven Tuesday that none of the parasites brought from Europe Monday on the steamer New York for the purpose of killing off the gypsy moths in New England, would be sent into this state. All of them are going into Massachusetts.

Caterpillars, which will some day become gypsy moths if the parasites give them time to mature, were caught in Europe and sent to this country to save the maple sugar crop of New England. The destructive parasites adhere to the caterpillars, so to get the needed parasites the caterpillars had to be taken. The gypsy moth has been a source of great annoyance to the forestry experts of northern New England states, who have started a campaign to get rid of them.

PERSONS TALKED ABOUT
John Shea, an Indian of Hoquiam, Wash., shot a silver-tipped otter, the first of its kind seen on the north coast in many years, and sold it for \$320.

Ida Lewis, keeper of the Lime Rock lighthouse on the southern end of Newport harbor, celebrated her 53d anniversary at the lighthouse July 1.

Mrs. Blanche H. Mason, a Washington state factory inspector, reports that while the child-labor law is disregarded in some instances, the fact is not due so much to willful intent as to ignorance of the law.

Gov. Stubbs of Kansas has given notice that he will resign from the most exclusive social club of Topeka unless it abolishes the locker system, which permits members to keep on hand liquors for their own use.

Lord Avebury, now 75 years old, is the first person who was ever photographed in England. M. Daguerre took his famous discovery to London, where he showed it to Lord Avebury's father, who allowed a picture of his son to be taken.

The new president of ancient Union college at Schenectady, N. Y., Dr. Charles A. Richmond, is able to announce the raising of the \$100,000 needed to meet the conditional offer of \$100,000 made by the general education board, so that the endowment will thus be increased by \$200,000.

Lord Burton of England is dead. His grandfather a carter named Bass, founded the brewery at Burton, which now occupies considerably over 160 acres of land, employs over 3,000 men, pays \$1,500,000 a year duty and \$1,200,000 a year freights and has a yearly revenue of \$25,000,000.

Dr. C. L. Moorehouse of New York city, 87 years old, whose father was an aid-de-camp of Gen. Washington, has been assured by the war department that he is the last surviving son of a man who fought in the revolutionary war. His father was born in 1745, and died in 1847 at the age of 102, and Dr. Moorehouse was born September 16, 1822, at Cazenova, N. Y. Dr. Moorehouse, by the way, is not a member of the Sons of the Revolution.

Judge Henry P. Hedges of Bridgeport, N. Y., according to the university secretary, is the oldest living graduate of Yale. He is the only surviving member of the class of '38. Chester Dutton of Concordia, Kan., who had been for a year the oldest surviving alumnus, died on Saturday. Word has been received that William F. Cooper of New York city, a member of the class of '38, died recently, leaving Judge Hedges the sole survivor.

\$30,000 STOREHOUSE.
S. A. Lewis Co. to Build Six-Story Fireproof Structure in New Haven.

At New Haven Tuesday the permit was taken out from the building inspector's office for what will probably be by far the largest storage warehouse in the city. The permit has been issued to the S. A. Lewis Storage and Transfer company for the erection of a modern and absolutely fireproof storage warehouse on Olive street, next to their present storehouse and office at 35 Olive street. The new structure, which will be entirely of brick and concrete construction, will be six stories in height, will front 37 feet on Olive street, and will have a depth of 174 feet. The building will cost \$30,000.
