Degree Conferred Upon Dr Cook

That of Doctor Honoris Causa, the Highest in the Gift of the University of Copenhagen—Explorer Again Promises Complete Record.

Copenhagen, Sept. 9.—The degree of doctor honoris causa was conferred upon Dr. Frederick A. Cook by the university of Copenhagen this afternoon in the presence of the crown prince of Denmark and a distinguished gathering.

Professor Torp, rector of the university, in presenting the diploma to Dr. Cook spoke of the admiration his achievement had aroused in the university, and declared that the news that another famous explorer had solved the same problem could in no way detract from the honor due Dr. Cook.

Dr. Cook Accepts the Honor. In expressing his thanks, Dr. Cook said he accepted the honor as testimony of the genuineness of his journey. He promised to send to the university his complete records, and he repeated that it was his intention to dispatch a ship to Greenland at his own expense to bring down the two Eskimos who accompanied him on his expedition. In conclusion, the doctor said: "I can say no more; I can do no more. I show you my hands."

1,200 Persons Present. The ceremony took place in the great hall of the university, in the presence of a company numbering 1,200 persons, including a number of scientists. When Professor Torp handed the parchment to Dr. Cook, the explorer arose to reply, but he was unable to speak for five minutes, on account of the continued applause. Dr. Cook's words in referring to the

records he said he would send to the university were: "I can produce all desirable evidence that I reached the North Pole." He added that his Eskimo companions would be taken to New York where they could be examined by impartial men of science.

Impressiveness of ceremony. The function of conferring this degree was very impressive. In the honor of Dr. Cook the entire body of professors and students entered the hall in procession. They were accompanied by the Danish ministers of education and commerce, and Maurice Egan, the American minister to Denmark. An orchestra rendered one of Beethoven's symphonies.

Professor Torp said that the honor conferred upon Dr. Cook was the highest in the gift of the university, and he complimented the explorer on the courage and self-sacrifice which enabled him to go where no human being had ever set his foot before. He said that Denmark and the United States would now be neighbors in the far north. Then, with enthusiasm, he declared that the Danish people not only admired Dr. Cook for his deeds, but also because he was an American.

A crowd of more than one thousand persons that had congregated outside the hall, cheered Dr. Cook as he left, and followed his motor car.

Dr. Cook and Mr. Egan are going tonight to the country residences of the premier, Count Holstein, where they will remain until tomorrow evening. Dr. Cook will then go to Flushing, where he will board the steamship Oscar II. on Saturday.

The Softened Outlook.

The scars of the wounds made by that terrible war in the '60s of the last century have healed and are covered over, for the great majority of the people of this country have known of it only as history. Its events are discussed by them as belonging to another time, and so far as bitterness is concerned almost as though they belonged to another nation. Dixie is coming to be as truly a national anthem as the Star Spangled Banner. The statue of Robert E. Lee, the gift of the state of Virginia, is placed in the national hall of fame with that of Abraham Lincoln and no protest is heard.
